

This Indenture

His Wth D^riderchire Bemwell The Right Honorable John
made the Twenty fifth - day of august - in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirteen
Lord Rolle, John Sampson Esquire Richard Mothersall Hallett Clerk, Richard Nossiter Bernard Lupton Clement Drake and Samuel Palmer Gentlemen
surviving ffessors of the Parish Lands of the Parish of Colyton of the one part and John Hallett of Ottery Saint Mary in the County of Devon lesuueine of the other
part Wth Mth Sth that they the said John Lord Rolle John Sampson Richard Mothersall Hallett Richard Nossiter Bernard Lupton Clement Drake and Samuel
Palmer for and in consideration of the Yearly Rent and of the covenants and conditions hereinafter mentioned which on the part and behalf of the said John Hallett their Executors and Administrators are or ought to be
observed performed fulfilled and kept Hth and each and every of them Hth Demised and Leased and by these presents Dth and such and every of them Dth Demise and Lease unto the said John Hallett
and John Cawley and John Cawley their Executors and Administrators Hth that close called Clippes Hill containing about two acres (be the same more or less) situate lying and being in the parish of Ottery Saint Mary aforesaid and now in the occupation of
Roger Johnnie as Tenant to the said ffessors Except and always reserved out of this present Demise unto the said ffessors their Heirs successors or assigns all and all manner of Timber and other Trees Young Impe
and saplings of what nature or kind soever now or hereafter standing growing or being on the said demised premises or any part thereof with liberty to and for the said ffessors their Heirs successors and assigns and their
Bailiffes Bailiffs for the time being to enter into and upon the said premises or any part thereof to fell cut down root up work and carry away the said excepted Trees and to cart and carry away the same with Horses carts
and Carriages at their Wills and pleasure Dth Hth and to hold the said Premises hereby demised with the Appurtenances unto the said John Hallett their Executors and Administrators from the twenty fifth
Day of March next for and during and unto the full End and Term of seven Years from thence next ensuing and fully to be compleat and ended Wth Mth Sth the following Year and every Year
during the said Term unto the said ffessors their Heirs successors or assigns for and in respect of the said Premises the Yearly Rent or sum of Eleven Pounds of goods and Causal Money of Great Britain by four
equal Quarterly Payments to be made on Day of the most usual Feasts or Days of Payment in the year (that is to say) Midsummer Michaelmas Christmas and Lady Day the first payment therof to begin and be made
at Midsummer Day next ensuing the date hereof Hth the said John Hallett do hereby for themselves Executors and Administrators covenant promise and agree to and with the said ffessors their Heirs successors and
Assigns in manner following that is to say that they the said John Hallett and Executors or administrators shall and will yearly and every year during the said Term well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto
the said ffessors their Heirs successors or Assigns the said Yearly Rent above named at the Days and Times and in manner and Term aforesaid according to the purport true intent and meaning of these presents
Hth Hth shall bring into and upon each and every acre and so in proportion to every part of an Acre of the said premises that shall be so ploughed and within six Months next before the Sowing
thereof either fifteen Hogsheads of good well beaten stone Lime or one hundred and twenty fars of good rotten stall or stable Dung and manage and spread abroad the same thereon in a good husbandlike manner
and may have and take in respect of such Dressing Two Crops of Corn or grain and no more the first to be Wheat and the other Barley or Oats and shall sow with each Acre of such second Crop and so in
proportion to every part of an Acre thereof Eight Pounds of Clover and Two Pecks of Sow or Trapil Grass seeds according to the Rules of good husbandry and shall not break up the same within Two Years next after such
second Crop nor at any time without first bringing in and upon and spreading abroad on the said Premises the like quantity of Dressing and taking such crop of Corn or grain as is before mentioned
nor shall the said John Hallett take more than two Crops of Wheat during the said Term and shall permit the said ffessors or their future tenants to enter in such of the said Closes as shall be in Erish or was in
the preceding year to bear and not then to graze seeds sown thence on the Twenty fifth day of December next before the End of the Term to plough back up and prepare the same for Corn or grain as to do therewith as they
shall think proper without making any satisfaction for the same. But if the said John Hallett shall be desirous to plant the said Close or any part thereof to Potatoes he has liberty so to do provided an additional
quantity of Manure such as six Hogsheads of lime or Sixty fars of Dung be brought into and upon each and every Acre thereof over and above the Dressing before mentioned Hth shall not top lop or pare any Morden Tree or
Trees growing or to grow on the said Premises at any time during the Term nor cut have or take any Hedge or other Wood growing or to grow on the said Premises but once during the said Term nor at any time without
paying new making stretching and fencing the Hedges where such Wood shall be cut in a good husbandlike manner under the penalty of five shillings for every Pole of Hedge that shall not be so new made
stretched and fenced and shall keep in good repair the Hedges Gates Posts Bars & Stiles of and belonging to the said Premises during the said Term and so leave the same at the End thereof Hth
Hth shall bring into and upon each and every Acre and so in proportion to every part of an Acre thereof (over and above the Dressing hereinbefore mentioned) that shall be tilled or sowed and the straw or hay carried off
and consumed elsewhere twenty fars of good rotten stall or stable Dung and spread abroad the same thereon in a good husbandlike manner or shall forfeit and pay the sum of One shilling and six pence in lieu of
every such farn of Dung that shall not be so brought in and consumed on the said Premises in manner as aforesaid Hth shall pay and discharge the land tax church and poor Rates wherewith the said Premises
shall be charged or chargeable during the said Term as the same is now or hath of late been rated Hth shall not nor will let set assign or otherwise dispose of the possession of the said premises at any time during the Term
without the consent in writing of the said ffessors their Heirs or Successors Provided Wth Mth Sth and these presents are upon this condition that if the said Yearly Rent above reserved or any part thereof
shall be behind or unpaid by the space of fourteen Days next after either of the said Days on which the same ought to be paid and no Distress can be found whereby to levy the same with the arrears (if any) and costs and
charges attending the same Wth Hth the said John Hallett and John Cawley Executors or Administrators do not will and truly observe perform fulfill and keep all and singular the Covenants conditions and agreements hereinbefore contained to be
thus observed performed fulfilled and kept Hth and in such case for either of the causes aforesaid it shall and may be lawful to and for the said ffessors their Heirs successors or Assigns unto and upon
the said premises to reenter and the same to have again repossess and enjoy as in his and their just and former Estate any thing contained to the contrary notwithstanding Hth the said ffessors do hereby severally
separately and not jointly one for the other covenant to and with the said John Hallett their Executors and Administrators in manner following that is to say that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said
John Hallett and Executors and Administrators by and under payment of the said Yearly Rent and Performance of all and singular the Covenants conditions and agreements hereinbefore contained to be
by him and them observed performed fulfilled and kept peaceably and quietly to have hold use occupy possess and enjoy all and singular the said Premises hereby demised without the lawful let suit trouble hindrance
or Detriment of them the said ffessors their Heirs or Successors or any other person or persons whatsoever Wth Mth Sth the said Parties to these Presents their hands and seals have set the Day and year just written
