

HIS INDENTURE made the first day of May in the fifteene and twentieth year of the raigne of our Sovereign Lord Charles the second Kinge of Englande. And in the year of our Lord God One thousand six hundred and seveteen and three. Betweene Robert Farrant, Peter Blakfalle, Richard Newton, Francis Baynall, Peter Duren, Phillip Mitchell, John Halson, John Whiter, John Baslegh and Peter Soller. Seller ffofficer of the English Lands of Colyton in the County of Devon of the one parte. And George Barker of Bideford in the County of Dorsette bate of the other parte. **Witnesseth** that the said Robert, & ffarrant, Peter Blakfalle, Richard Newton, Francis Baynall, Peter Duren, Phillip Mitchell, John Halson, John Whiter, John Baslegh and Peter Soller by and w^te the consent and assent of the Quicke men of the shire of Colyton aforesaid as well for aid and consideration of the summe of One hundred and fiftie pounds of lawfull money to them the said ffofficer or some of them w^te and truly paid all and before thenselvynge and delivery therof by the said George Barker the roght whereof is hereby acknowledge^d. as also for aid and consideration of the yearly rent hereafter in aid by these presents mentioned and reserved to be payed to the said ffofficer or their assignes **have** demised, leased, granted, and so farre lett unto the said George Barker All stables, ymages and tenement at Hamptoun in the said shire of Shute in the County of Devon aforesaid commonly called excurse by the name of Whits Dene. Contra^r to all houses,outhoues, gardens, bathards and seuerall places excepte of land and pasture to the said ffofficer and to him selfe and in anywise appertayninge. All w^t said premises now are in the use or occupation of the said George Barker his assigne or assignes except and alwayes reserved out of the said ffofficer or them selfe or to the said ffofficer or assignes their heire and assignes all the tyme now p^rovynge or to come excep^t the same after shall ymagine or be in and upon the premises or any parte thereof in free libertie to aid for the said ffofficer or assignes their Baylye or Baylyes servante or servantes to keepe fytte doone and carry away the same at his and their will and pleasure duringe the tyme only excepted and reserved that is to sayt tyme and every yere and partie thereof to the said ffofficer except before excepted unto the said George Barker his exente & admist^d and assignes imediately from and after the third day of May last past the date hereof for aid duringe the tyme and tyme of countree and nintene years from thence next ensuynge and fully to be compylated expid and entred into the said George Barker and Elizabeth Barker his daughter on or about the xxiiijth day of March next ensuinge or any other of them for longesse that happen for longesse. **Yealdynge** and payinge theron yearly and every yere duringe the said tyme unto the said Robert Farrant, Peter Blakfalle, Richard Newton, Francis Baynall, Peter Duren, Phillip Mitchell, John Halson, John Whiter, John Baslegh and Peter Soller aforesaid and to their ffofficer or assignes the summe or yearly rent of fiftie pounds of lawfull money of England on the first day of November and on the third day of May by even and equal partes. **And alsoe** the said George Barker giveth to these presents to his exente & admist^d and assignes and every of them beinge deuenant at Combe on the possession of the premises by some hit of shall doe sute to all the dñe of Survey of the said ffofficer their heire and assignes in shal be holden in the shire of Colyton aforesaid as other shire Combe of the said shire Lands haide done or ought to doe upon reasonable maner to him or them given. **And** the said George Barker for himselfe his exente & admist^d and assignes and for every of them doth deuenant and quarell to and w^t the said Robert Farrant, Peter Blakfalle, Richard Newton, Francis Baynall, Peter Duren, Phillip Mitchell, John Halson, John Whiter, John Baslegh and Peter Soller their heire and assignes and to aid and contry of them by these presents that he the said George Barker his exente & admist^d and assignes shall and will all his and those othes exente & admist^d and assignes w^t hold and maydayne all and singuler the said demised and every yere thereof in battenge, lumberinge, thaltinge, bovininge and all and all maner of other needfull and necessary reparacions whatsover whon and as often as need shall require duringe the said tyme and in the end of the said tyme the same premises for all and suffitiently repaired shall and will leave and yield up into the hands and possession of the said ffofficer or assignes **But** if it shall happen that the said yearly rent of fiftie pounds of lawfull money of England shall be behinde and unpaid yngarde or in all by the space of thre and twentie dayes next after any of the said dayes of payment in to das is aforesaid it ought to be payd the same beinge lawfully demanded and shal not payd and noe sufficient distresse in or upon the premises in the mean tyme tare or may be found for the levynge of the said rent for beinge behinde w^t the aforesaid tyme of payement shall happen to be **Or** if the said George Barker his exente & admist^d and assignes or any of them shal wilfully doe or by his or their aforesaid exente & admist^d suffer to be done any hit or arys thynge or thynge whatsoever w^t shall or may fnde or be to the p^rudenc, hundre, or chyf^rtye of the said ffofficer their heire and assignes of the said premises or any yere thereof. **Or** if the said George Barker his exente & admist^d or assignes or any of them shal signe or sett over the said premises or any yere thereof his or their estate title deuine or interest of in or to the same or any yere thereof to any person or persons whatsoever other then to the wife, chylde or chyldeyn of the said ffofficer their heire or assignes or the most yere of them therunto first had and obtained in writing under their handes. **That** then for every or any of the causes aforesaid this indenture and roght and the tyme therby limited shall take deuine and be vnyed and then and from thenceforth for all or any of the said causes ill shall and may be lawfull to aid for the said ffofficer their heire and assignes and every of them into all and singuler the said demised premises w^t their appurtenis to reenter and the same to have againe, retayne and enioy as in their first and former estate theseff, deuines or any thinge in them contained to the roght therof in anywise notwithstandinge. **And** the said Robert Farrant, Peter Blakfalle, Richard Newton, Francis Baynall, Peter Duren, Phillip Mitchell, John Halson, John Whiter, John Baslegh and Peter Soller ffofficer or the said and their heire all the aforesaid premises by these presents demised and every yere and partie thereof except before excepted unto the said George Barker his exente & admist^d and assignes in manner and forme aforesaid and under the roght aforesaid condicione and capitall before expressid and reserved aginst the high Roade for all his thronys fute and services as also aginst them selves the said ffofficer and their heire and assignes and every of them shall and will remaine anguill and defend by these presents abouerment haue to the said ffofficer or assignes to set their handes and seal the day and yere first above written. 1673.
