PROMISSORY NOTES, payable in any other manner than to bearer on DEMAND,—or if exceeding £100, whether to bearer on demand or otherwise, the same duty as on Bills of Exchange.

DRAFT or ORDER, payable Bearer or to Order on DEMAND, On Penny.

**RECEIPTS.**

RECEIPT or Discharge on payment of money amounting to Two Pounds or upwards, ONE PENNY.

The Exemption in favour of letters acknowledging receipt of Bills, Notes, &c. is now REPEALED, and such letters are made liable to the Receipt Stamp Duty.

To calculate the price of articles purchased at Pence only, multiply the number of pounds, yards, &c. by the price, and divide by 12, which gives the amount in Shillings.

**Rule for Calculating Interest at Five per Cent.**

Multiply the Pounds by the Days, and divide the product by 365. The quotient gives the Interest at Five per cent. in Shillings.
