part and John Coape of the same ^{parish} of the other part witnesseth that the said will Harcourt hath put himselfe apprentice unto the
said John Coape from the day of the date hereof untill he the said will Harcourt shall accomplish the age of Twenty four yeres to
be by him the said John Coape taught and instructed in Husbandry by all which said t^{er}me the said will Harcourt the said
John Coape as his master well and truly shall serve, his secrets shall keepe, his commaundments lawfull and honest sworn whoso shall
doe the good of his said master inordinably shall not waste, nor from his masters service wither by day nor night shall absent or

to give and deliver unto the said apprentice two suits of apparell fit for him to have and wear w^{ch} of the one to be for

John Coape



This indenture made the thirtieth day of August in the tenth and twentieth years of the reign of our sovereign lord Charles, by the grace of God King of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, ex. Betwixt Edward Ebdon of the gift of tolliton of the one part, and John Crab of the gift of the said Smith, of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Edward Ebdon, hath put and bound himselfe apprentice, with the foresaid John Crab and after the manner of an apprentice with him to dwell from the date of these presents, unto the end and terme of seven years, next ensuinge, and fully to be compleate and ended, and for and in consideration of oyle fillings, the said Edward is to abide with him one whole year, after the foresaid terme shall be expired; according to a condition and covenant betwixt them, duringe all while said terme, the said Edward, his master, well and faithfully shall serve, his servants shall keep, his commandments lawfull and honest, every where shall doe, the goods of his said master mordinately shall not waste, nor from his service either by day or night absent himselfe, but as a true and faithful servant ought to becom himselfe in word and deed; And the said John unto the said Edward in the tract of a smith, with the new stile, after the best manner that he can or may, shall teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, as much as to the said tract belongeth or in any wise appertaineth, also findings unto the said servant, meate drinke, sinnon, woollen hose, shoes, and all other things needfull as well in season as quality, and at the end of the said terme shall give the said servant, oyle fillings for his last years work as above said, and provide for him two futes of apparel, five for him to ease and wear, the one for sundays the other for workinge days; In witness whereof, the parties abovesaid to this indenture interchangably have put their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
