Colyton in Devon.

Wherof the parishes church of this parish of Colyton being now in verie great repair and decaye not onlie
in the timber worke of the roofe of the churche of the said church, but also all the leaded over the north side
therof are somwhat decayed, that if the same be not presently repaired, it will in verie soone tyme growe to
a charge greater charge than the parishes: wherefore upon good consideration had therof, it is thought fitt
aswell by the churchwardens of the parishes of the said church, as also by the churchwardens in the church of the
said church, that the said church should be presently sett forth, and so goe on with
the same: And forasmuch as there is no sufficient at this present in the parishes of the
said church to paye the charge therof, neither canne the said churchwardens presently be sett forth, except some
be disbursed before hand by some well disposed person by waye of loan towards the same, but it
is thought as the same maye be repaired herein out of the revenues and profite of the said churchwardens
upon the parishes launde: And therefore the churchwardens and churchwardens, men of the said church and other the
chiefest inhabitants of the said parishes whose names are hereunder subscribed, doe by these
presentes firmely promise to repaye and satisfie all and every summe and somme of money as shall
by any person or persons whatsoever by what soe loan delivered unto the churchwardens of the said
parishes (they giving Notes under their handes for the verite therof) out of the said money
that shall be by any waye or meane received of the revenues and profite of the parishes launde
aforesaid (excepting out of some twentie nobles or some pounde yearly towards the most necessary
payments of such money as the parishes churchwardens of the said church for the tyme being, now are
and hereafter shall be appointed by any Note subscribed by the churchwardens of the said church and churchwardens
men or the more parte of them, to paye for & in the behalf of the parishes aforesaid) in
the said churchwardens and other the inhabitants of the
said parishes have hereunto subscribed our names and sett to our signes
the daye and yeare abovesayd written.
