 poundes of good & lawfull money of England to remayne in his hands and by him to bee  
 employed for the setting on worke of such people in Colton w<sup>ch</sup> in the said parish of Colton ab  
 shall not bee able to procure themselves worke from tyme to tyme; y<sup>e</sup> therefore the said  
 John Herod & Peter Tuten or one of <sup>them</sup> their or one of their executors or administrators  
 shall & doe w<sup>ch</sup> in the space of thre monethes next after newinge to hem or one of hem in this  
 behalfe to bee given by the above named Walter Yonge & John Burnard or either of them, their  
 or either of their executors or assigned, with a true assw<sup>er</sup>e & p<sup>ro</sup>ve in our cause to bee truly  
 paid in unto the said Walter Yonge & John Burnard or one of them their or one of their executors  
 or assigned the said sume of Twentie poundes of good & lawfull money of England. Then this  
 obligation to bee void, or else to bee in force.
