Wall paintings

Mr H. Hooper, last month, on stripping the wall paper from the walls of the Feoffee Chamber for the purpose of repairing, found two wall paintings. (These had been seen by Mr Skinner some 10 or 15 years ago.)

The painting, on the west wall of the chamber, between the two windows, is a female figure, resting her left arm on the cross-bar of a large anchor painted black.

The other, on the north end of the east wall, near the strong cupboard, is a painting of the resurrection of our Lord. He is depicted stepping out (one foot being outside) of a black painted coffin shaped tomb, the lid of which is leaning against the tomb. There is apparently the figure of the Angel who rolled away the stone. The figure of our Lord is only faintly shown from repeated scrapings.
