(b) That the Commissioners have instructed Mr G. W. Wallace, one of the Assistant Commissioners, to visit Colyton in order to confer with the Trustees on the other matters referred to in the recent correspondence.

(c) That, if any expenditure on buildings should be authorised, directions will be given for sufficient stock to be sold to provide the required amount.

The question arose, whether the remainder of the proceeds, over the £2000, should be invested in the India 3½ per cent, or in some other stock.
