On Wednesday November 3rd, at the invitation of the Vicar & Churchwardens, the Chairman, M.M. H.H. Board, & Messrs J. Follett, E. H. Cuming, J. Lealley, Mr Bowden Smith, A. J. P. Skinner, W. Smeethland, H. J. Clegg, J. Stokes, & G. Sprague, members of the Chamber of Feoffees, attended a special Service at the Parish Church, for the purpose of dedicating & restarting the Church Clock, which had been recently restored, & its dials repainted.

After a brief dedicatory service by the Vicar, Revd. H.S. Hyatt, the Chairman, M.M. H.H. Board, was requested, on behalf of the Feoffees, for the benefit of the Parishioners, to set the Clock working. After the clock has struck 8, Mr. Hall, of R.O.S. Exeter, who gave his services gratuitously, delivered an address on the history of time, & its effects on daily life.

The Cost of restoring the Clock was about £ 50.
