in a fairly satisfactory condition, more care was required of the hose, which needed oiling with good thick fish oil, the hydrant boxes required examining and clearing out periodically, in order to avoid any delay in fixing of stand pipes, in his opinion the appliances would prove capable of good service in the future, as in the past.

On the proposition of Mr. Tompsett, seconded by Col. Henderson, the Clerk was requested to see that Northcott cleared out the water sluices quarterly, also cleared out hydrant boxes & fixed hydrants periodically. Carried
