## High St. SITE

The following letter was received from the Charity Commissioners - Referring to your letter of the 10<sup>th</sup> inst, I am to say that the Trustees are at liberty to submit definite proposals in regard to the development of the site in Colyton High St., on the basis of a total expenditure of £3000. 0. 0.

It will be understood that the Commissioners cannot definitely approve proposals until full details have been submitted to and considered by them.

A letter was also received from Mr. Symons respecting the above site and one from Mr. Gover Baker & East, stating that if the Chamber would erect suitable premises thereon for the carrying on of his business he would be prepared to rent same on the longest possible lease at a 5% Interest Rental basis on the outlay.

After a long discussion on the best and various ways of developing the site, Mr. Cuming proposed, & Mr. R. Smith seconded, (Mr. Tollett supporting) "That a public building for the benefit of the town of Colyton be erected on the site, and that any available land, after the erection of such building (& the various offices connected therewith) be utilized in the best possible manner by the Chamber."

After further consideration, on the proposition being put to the meeting it was carried unanimously.

### Water Supply

Mr. Board brought forward his motion respecting the water supply of Colyton and spoke of the dirty condition of the water occasionally, owing, in his opinion, to the inadequate flushing of pipes and turning off supply at night, also raising the question as to whether the present supply was equal to the demand, with extra houses being erected &c, from figures supplied, the supply was estimated to be 21 gallons per head per day. After considerable discussion, the

Water bailiff was called in and asked several questions respecting same, ultimately it was agreed to defer the matter for further consideration, and that the Committee should visit the Reservoir and take a measurement of the water in one of the tanks, the town supply to be then turned on for the night, & the water again measured the next morning, in order to check if any wastage had occurred during the night, in the Town service.
