of Decr 1815. pursuant to notice given, ^{in the Church} it is resolved
and ordered as follows. Whereas all the surviving Feoffees
and twenty Men having for a long time been
desirous of electing persons in the room of the
Feoffees & Twenty Men who are dead. A Chamber
Meeting was held on the 5th day of Octr last
pursuant to Notice at which the Feoffees and
Twenty Men then present nominated & elected
the several persons in the Minutes of the said
Meeting, mentioned to be Feoffees, and Twenty
Men, all of whom the surviving Feoffees and
Twenty Men considered to be fit and proper
persons to fill up the vacancies in the Trust
as aforesaid conformable to former precedents and
the ~~Articles~~ & Authorities prescribed for that
purpose; but Mr. Sam'l Palmer the other of the
surviving Feoffees who was not present at the
said Meeting; Altho' he had by Letters & otherwise
expressed a wish that the said Vacancies in the
Trust might be filled up & nominated Sir W^m
Pole Bart. John Hallett Esq and others, as proper
persons to be Feoffees but has since signified his
Dissent to the aforesaid Nomination, & Election,
as being irregular, and contrary to the Articles & to
former precedents; wherefore the Feoffees and Twenty
Men now present conceiving that the reason
for Mr. Palmers Dissent is the Election of Mr.
Tucker to be a Feoffee, who it has since been
discovered has no Estate in the Parish of Colyton.

They the said Feoffees and twenty other now present have resolved to, and do nominate and elect —

Sir W^m Dole Bart^r J^r Manwood Elton, Francis Drake, and J^r Hallett Esq^r. The Revd Frederick Barnes, the Revd J. W. Gill, Sam^e Sampson Gent and John Snook Tanner to be Feoffees and Richd. Little, Chas. Northam and Rob^t Matthews Shopkeepers, W^m Mayne Tailor & Chandler Rob^t Stocker Confectioner, Jo^r Scobell Builder Nicholas Hatchwell Cooper, and John Mitchell W^m Spiller and W^m Hoskins Yeomen to be Twenty Men, and we order Mr Clement Drake to prepare the Geffment Deed and the Articles of Agreement between the Feoffees and twenty men, & other Deeds necessary to compleat this election, but in case Mr Palmer should continue to dissent to the Election now made, the filling up of the Trust must be postponed until the number of the Feoffees is reduced to Three. It is also ordered that Mr Clement Drake be desired to transact and manage the business relating to the Trust as an Attorney and Solicitor, and to inspect and regulate the Title Deeds relating to the Estates belonging to the Trust; and to make a Schedule thereof, and three copies of the same, one of such copies to be kept by himself and another be delivered to the Baileiff, and the other to one of the Feoffees which copies are to be delivered over to every succeeding Solicitor & Baileiff, & to another Feoffee on the death of the one

which might have the custody of such other copy. And it is also ordered that Mr. Clem. Drake do prepare an extract of the Feoffment Deed and of the Articles of Agreement, and deliver a copy to each of the Feoffees and twenty men. And it is ~~also~~ ordered that the Baillif do make an offer to John Hallett the Tenant of Clapps Hill & Smiths Field ^{in Ottery} to allow out of his Rent from Lady day next the sum of £s. 10^d and that the Baillif do inform Thomas Game Tenant of the Lands in Colyford, that if he will immediately pay the shears of Rent due at Michael's last, an allowance will be made him of ~~of £10~~ and that on his payment of Rent which will be due at Lady day next, an allowance will be made him thereout of ~~of £10~~, and that after Lady Day next any allowance will be made out of his Rent 38L per Annum, but in case the said Thos. Game should not accede to the before mentioned terms that the Baillif do pursue proper means to recover the ~~the Rent~~ now due; and if the said Thos. Game should not be able to continue Tenant of the said Lands after Lady day next, the Baillif do advertise the same, together with Gibbs Close in Ottery to be let at the next meeting, if Mr. Turner the present Tenant ^{of the Feoffment Close} should not agree to continue the same.
