At a Chamber Meeting held this Day pursuant to the following Notice, ^{given in the Council on Sunday 27th Inst} - A Meeting will be holden on Tuesday next 29th Inst at ten o'clock in the Morning to consider of Steps proper to be taken in consequence of a vacancy in the Office of Stewardship by the death of the late Sheriff Geo^o Dowe Major and on other business relating to the Town.

It was unanimously agreed that an advertisement be inserted in the Public Newspapers for a Sheriff in the following Terms.

a Master for the Parish Free School at Colyton to teach Boys Reading, Writing and Arithmetic. The Salary according to the Number of the Boys nominated by the Chamber one pound six shillings a year for each with four shillings for the Master to provide Pens Ink and Paper. - The Number at present is 25. augmentable at the Discretion of the Chamber. The Master is allowed the Occupation of the Church House free of Rent excepting a part retained for the use of the Feoffees and Twenty-men. A considerable number of Day Scholars may be expected in addition for the Enrolment of the Master and there is also accommodation for Boarders.

Candidates are required to send Testimonials of their Qualifications directed to Mr John Smith Colyton near Axminster or before Saturday the 30th of November, previous to the Election which is fixed for Jan^y the first 1832. —

At the same time it was agreed that a Committee of five persons among the Feoffees and Twenty-men should be appointed as Visitors of the School to take upon themselves the care of inspecting the State of the School weekly and recording the same in a Book to be kept for the purpose which shall be produced at the Annual Meeting of the Chamber, when the Visitors will be re-appointed or new ones elected as may be thought fit.

Ordered that Mr John Smith be requested to superintend the repairs ordered to be ordered and to attend generally to the business of the Feoffees in consequence of the Infirmary state of Health of Mr Sam^l Smith.

Ordered that Mr Rev^d D Barnes Mr Pugh & Mr Southern be requested to engage a proper person to carry on the School until a new Master be appointed.

Ordered that the floor of the School Room be inspected with a view to placing a new floor of Timber & if it be advisable & the funds admit of it, that it be undertaken without delay. —

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At a Meeting this day held agreeably to a Notice given - It was ^{unanimously resolved} ~~ordered~~ that a Committee of the whole body of Freeees and Twenty Men be formed to superintend and particularly assist in the business of the Free School, and considering that the conduct of Boys ^{whilst out of school -} ~~is~~ greatly important, their moral education being of much greater moment than their intellectual improvement both as regards their own happiness and the good of Society and it being evident that in a day school the Master has it not in his power to attend to this part effectually - It is considered by this Meeting imperiously necessary that a Committee of the whole body should take this duty especially under their own charge as being Inhabitants of the place they will have the opportunity of doing so without trouble that the performance of such a duty would be of great assistance to the Master without at all interfering with his duty and authority within the walls of his School.

It is also ^{unanimously} resolved that the s.^d Committee of the whole body should have the nomination of the Boys to be on the foundation, the regulation of the time of their continuance

and the general management of any
 parts for the welfare of the School
 It is also unanimously resolved that previous
 to the admission of the Master he be required
 to sign a declaration in the Order Book
 that he inhabits the apartments in the
 School House allotted to him only as a
 part of his emolument as a School Master
 and that he promises to give up ^{possession of} the Premises
 in due order to the same authorities which
 place him there whenever he ceases to be
 Master of the School. The Foot Fee Room
