Colyton Feoffees & Dars

Sir

"I have received your communication and
the resolutions of the Feoffees for which I
am much obliged. — On looking at these
Papers I find there is a right of entry
reserved to the old Feoffees under the
Lease to Minifie & Dodge on selling
or disposing of the Premises
or any part thereof without consent in
writing of the Feoffees. In 1806 Mrs
Jane Grigg bought the share of Robert Grigg.

" which was then assigned to her and it is said
 " that Mr. Sam^t. Palmer who then acted for the
 " Feoffees gave the licence required. In 1818
 " Mrs Jane Grigg bought the remaining shares
 " of Eliz^t Smith and Leah Grigg and those were
 " assigned to her and so for 33 years as to one
 " part and 23 years as to the other part she has
 " been in possession and her tenancy has been
 " acknowledged by the Feoffees. The lease to
 " Menifee and Dodge only contains a power
of reentry there is no proviso for
 " of the and they never entered, in one case
 " for 30 years & the second for upwards of 20.
 " I apprehend that under the 3rd & 4th Wm & M^t
 " Cap 27. Sec 2 & 3 the parties cannot now recover.
 " Courts of Law always lean against forfeitures
 " as Courts of Equity relieve against them
 " and the continual receipt of Rent by the Feoffees
 " for upwards of thirty years induces me to believe
 " that they cannot recover the property from Dare
 " but even were the right of the Feoffees clear as the
 " sun I cannot believe that any body of respectable
 " and upright men (like these Feoffees) - would
 " take advantage of a poor man upon a technical
 " point of this sort and more especially as the
 " change has been so beneficial to the Trust Property
 " under Mrs Grigg it was quite dilapidated
 " whilst Dare has put it in thorough repair
 " (and at no distant day I fear) when the property

" shall come into hand I am sure it will be found
 " that the charity has been benefitted by the substitution
 " of Dare for Mrs Grigg as their Tenant.

" I wish the Feoffees would add a life or exchange
 " Mr Smith's life for another - I should be ready to
 " give a fair consideration. With respect to Mr.
 " Ward the Feoffees are at liberty to make use of any
 " proceeding they may take to vindicate their right
 " & they indemnifying Dare, or he shall surrender
 " any part of the wall to the Feoffees if they like
 " to proceed in their own names. In fact Dare
 " shall concur in any course the Feoffees are
 " advised is necessary.

 the question was put whether the offer
 of Dare be accepted to put the Chamber
 in possession so as to proceed against
 Mr Ward (if it should be so determined)

It was resolved unanimously not to
 disturb Dare, ^{possession} chiefly upon the consideration
 of the great improvement he has made in
 the property by the outlay of money to
 a considerable amount on the s^t. Premises

Also that Mr. Smarke be instructed to draw
a Case to be submitted to the opinion of
some eminent Counsel respecting the
right to the Wall in question between
the Property in possession of Mr. Dore and
that of Mr. Ward at Honiton.
