The Committee Appointed at a general Meeting of the Chamber held on the 9<sup>th</sup> September 1853 having met on the 15<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, & 23<sup>rd</sup> of the same Month recommended as the result of a lengthened and minute inspection and deliberation on former Articles and Deeds certain Alterations in the Old Articles as desirable to be made which after some Alteration in those proposed by the Committee were agreed to in this general Meeting in the following form

1<sup>st</sup> That the Charters of the Lands and all other Writings respecting Property invested in the Feoffees should be kept in the Iron Press in the Feoffee Room under three Locks and three Keys one to be kept by one of the Feoffees and the others by two of the Twenty Men

2<sup>nd</sup> That a Bailiff and Treasurer be elected by the Chamber and remain in Office during the pleasure of the Majority of the Chamber and that the said Bailiff and Treasurer should at any time if required give a Bond for the security of the different monies committed to their charge and in order to prevent waste on any part of the

Feoffees Estate the Baillif should inspect the Property twice every year and report thereon to the Chamber and in consideration of his services he should have such yearly stipend as the Majority of the Feoffees and twenty Men in their discretion should appoint and that the Baillif should collect the Rents and together with the Treasurer make up and produce to the Chamber their Accounts every half year within six Weeks after Lady Day and Michaelmas

3<sup>rd</sup> That no Lease should be granted without a

Conference of the Feoffees and Twenty Men of which Notice should be given by posting public Hand bills and that the letting of the Feoffee Land should be by tender or otherwise as the Majority of the Chamber should consider advisable for the Benefit of the Trust

4<sup>th</sup> That no lease should be granted for Lives nor for
