Thomas Waters's will Dated 8 June 1670

Items I give and Bequeath to the Poor of the Parish of Colyton three  
Pence in a year for ever to be distributed in Bread made of 14 loaves  
to the Dozen that a Man and his Wife may receive each of them one  
by the week so far as they will go according to the best discretion of  
the Distributors, and I appoint my Dear Wife Mary the first to  
bear this office and after her my Nephew John Waters during his  
Life, and after him whomsoever my Heirs or Executors shall in Trust  
But my Will is that they do not retain this Office to themselves  
and to this my Distributer or Dispenser I allow the Surplusage  
of Eight Shillings by the year for his Care and pains out of the said  
Three Pence. Furthermore for the better Security of this my  
Legacy unto perpetuity I have enabled and do enable  
much as in me lies by this my Will and Testament the  
Treasurer and Twenty men or the Overseers of the Poor for the time  
being to Command it as a Rent Charge upon Rowlands Ham  
as much as if I had made a Deed in Testament of it, enjoining  
them to take a Copy of this my Grant by Will out of the Office  
of Probates and keep it in their Parish Chamber amongst  
their other Records. — See Page 114 in this Book

The grant of the water course by Sir Jno. Pole and others

1641 unto Barnard Dapsell and others in Trust
