Articles of Agreement

- 1st That the Charter of the Lands and all other Writings respecting Property Invested in the Feoffees should be kept in the Box Room in the Feoffee Room under three Locks and three Keys one to be kept by one of the Feoffees and the others by two of the Twenty Men
- 2nd That a Bailiff and Treasurer be elected by the Chamber and remain in Office during the pleasure of the Majority of the Chamber and that the said Bailiff and Treasurer should at anytime if required give a Bond for the Security of the different Monies committed to their charge and in order to prevent waste on any part of the Feoffee Estate the Bailiff should inspect the Property twice every Year and report thereon to the Chamber and in consideration of his Services he should have such yearly stipend as the Majority of the Feoffees and Twenty Men in their discretion should appoint and that the Bailiff should collect the Rents and together with the Treasurer make up and produce to the Chamber their Accounts every half Year within six Weeks after Lady Day and Michaelmas.
- 3rd That no Lease should be granted without a Conference of the Feoffees and Twenty Men of which Notice should be given by Posting publick handbills and that the letting of the Feoffee Lands should be by tender or otherwise as the Majority of the Chamber should consider Advisable for the benefit of the Trust
- 4th That no Lease should be granted for lives nor for any period exceeding fourteen Years and then only with general consent of the Majority of the Feoffees and Twenty Men assembled at a Meeting of which two Days Notice should be given and in case any Lease should be agreed upon that the Feoffees should undertake to execute the same within twenty one Days after request

5th That such portion of the Income of the Feoffee Property as the state of the Trust may (in the judgment of the Chamber) render necessary for the purpose should be applied to the maintenance of a School in Colyton and the residue of the Income be expended in such Godly and commendable purposes for the public good and Deeds of Charity as should seem meet and convenient to the Feoffees and Twenty Men

6th That none of the Feoffees or twenty Men shall bestow or convert any part of the Income to any purpose whatsoever without the consent of the Majority of the Feoffees and twenty men

7th That no Feoffee should hold a lease under any circumstance but that he may Rent as a Yearly Tenant provided he be the highest bidder that a twenty Man may take a Lease if the Feoffees and twenty Men agree thereto for a Term not exceeding Seven Years.

8th That any of the twenty Men dealing contrary to their trust or being insufficient or obstinate or wilfully inclined to serve their own affections might be dismissed by the Majority of the Feoffees and twenty Men and others elected

9th That if any of the twenty Men should happen to remove and be no Householder within the Parish and shall have omitted to attend Meetings for the space of One Year he shall cease to be a Member of the Chamber and when Six of the twenty Men from Death or other cause be removed then Six other Men possessing Landed Property residing in the Parish shall be elected in their stead chosen by the Majority of the Feoffees and twenty Men called together for that purpose

10th When the Feoffees are reduced to three then the Survivors and twenty, Men shall without delay elect a competent number of New Feoffees and the Lands be conveyed to them within the space of three Months after such election

11 That a Clerk of the Market should be appointed to execute the Office and to hold a Court of Pie Powder and to keep a Book in which shall be inserted the matters agreed upon by the Feoffees and twenty other at their Meetings

12 That the Feoffees should not release or be nonsuit in any Action commenced by them relating to the Feoffee Property without the consent of the Feoffees and twenty Men

13 That these Articles should be read at such times as the Feoffees and twenty Men may think fit and necessary and if at any time they deem it proper that new Articles should be made and the old abolished altered and reformed as time or occasion may require that it may be in the power of the Feoffees and twenty Men as heretofore to make such Alterations or reformation in the said Articles as often as the Majority of the Feoffees and twenty other should deem expedient

It was also agreed upon that these Articles should (after final settlement of the Business) be Printed at the expence of the Chamber and a copy be Delivered to each Member to be indelivered to the Bailiff upon each ceasing to hold the Office
