To supply and lay down about 06 of the above named Pipe from the Town Lett to an Iron Recess in the Wall in Hill Street near Mr Mountstephens with an Iron Cistern with an Iron Cistern fix'd in the Town Lett Stop cock Sluice Box Stink Traps Grating Door & frame for the sum of Forty Seven Pounds As witness our hands this Twenty Sixth Day of June 1871
