I James Fowler do agree to undertake  
the office of Master of The Froffes School,  
being appointed thereto by the Chamber of  
Froffes and Twenty men of Colyton, under  
the following conditions

The Friends and Twenty men to pay the  
Master a salary of £80 (Eighty pounds)  
a year in half yearly <sup>quarterly</sup> payments and  
to allow him the use of the School  
house free of rates and taxes, reserving  
to themselves the sole use of the room  
in which their meetings are held, with  
free ingress and egress at their pleasure

The Master shall receive ~~six boys~~<sup>one girl</sup> into  
the School ~~six~~ free boys nominated  
by the Chamber<sup>to whom he shall</sup>  
give a sound English and Commercial  
education, with Latin and French if  
desired by The Proffers but shall incur the penalty of  
the fifth part of his annual income for every month

The Master shall receive the sum of  
residents in the parish of Colyton at Three  
Guineas a year for each and shall give  
them the same education as the free  
boys, with Latin and French unless objected  
to by their parents

may dismiss the Master without assigning

I James Fowler do hereby agree to the


