Copy of 3rd Letter to Mr. Hillman as per Order of the Chamber 7th September 1882

Sir Colyton Sep^r 9th 1882

The Feoffees of Colyton in reply to your letter of the 28th ulta instruct me to say they claim under the Will of Thomas Holmes of which the following is an extract from the Parliamentary Report of 1820. Thomas Holmes of Colyton by Will dated 8th June 1670 gave to the Poor of the Parish of Colyton 3£ a year for ever to be distributed in Bread made of 14 loaves to the Dozen that a Man and his Wife might receive each of them one by the week as far as they would go, according to the discretion of the distributor who was to be appointed by his heirs or Executors provided they should not retain this office to themselves and to such distributor be allowed the surplussage of 8p out of the said 3£ by the year for his care and pains. And for the better security of this legacy he authorized the Feoffees and Jacoby Man or the Overseers of the Poor for the time being of the Parish of Colyton to demand it as a reimbursement upon Rowlands Man. St Nicholas Salisbury December 11th 1882

My dear Sir

The subject on which I have to ^{cate} communicate to the Trustees of the Colyton Charity is the Hedge on the South side of a field called Donells Close which adjoins some land in Horiton belonging to the Colyton Charity. I bought this field a few years since of the Lord of the Manor of Horiton I have not been able to get information from the Steward of the Manor respecting the Ownerships of the Hedges; and I thought that the Hedge on the South side of the field belonged to me as well as the other Hedges. I happen however to have a Map which was made when my Gt Grandfather was Steward of the Manor and it occurred to me the other day to look at this Map which is very accurately and carefully made, all the Manor property being painted or lined in red while the rest is left in Black. I see by this map that the North End & West sides of the field are marked with red lines but that the South side is marked with Black. It follows I think indubitably that the South Hedge adjoining the Colyton Charity Property does not belong to me, I had just filled a tree in this Hedge which you can have if you please or else I will pay the value of it
