I John Mackaig do agree to undertake the office of Master of the Feoffee Grammar School by being appointed thereto by the Chamber of Feoffees and Twenty Men of Colyton under the following conditions, that is to say:—

The Master to take all boys resident within the parish of Colyton on the payment of three guineas a year from the parents of each boy, a like sum of three guineas, as a capitation fee, to be given by the Chamber of Feoffees and Twenty Men up to, but not exceeding, Fifty Pounds per year; such capitation fee, or stipend, to be paid at the end of each term.

The Master to have the privilege of taking Boarders and Day Pupils, other than those resident in the parish of Colyton, on his own terms, but in use of the ~~School~~ <sup>Dr. Salt</sup> ~~House~~ <sup>with</sup> ~~free~~ <sup>use</sup>. The Master shall have use of the ~~School~~ <sup>Dr. Salt</sup> ~~House~~ <sup>with</sup> ~~free~~ <sup>use</sup> School House free of all rates and taxes, always excepting the Room in which the Feoffees and Twenty Men hold their meetings and keep their Muniments of which they reserve the sole use with ingress and egress thereto and therefrom at their pleasure.

The Master shall be expected to devote his whole time to the duties of the School and shall give to each pupil a sound English and Commercial Education with Latin, French, and German, unless objected to by the parents of such pupil.

The Master further agrees to hold an Annual Public Examination of the Pupils by a competent Examiner, if required to do so by the Chamber of Feoffees and Twenty Men.

The Chamber of Feoffees and Twenty Men may dismiss the Master, without assigning any cause, after six months notice given to him in writing.

I John MacKraig do hereby agree to the foregoing conditions and declare that I will always to the best of my abilities discharge the duties of Master of the Feoffee Grammar School during my tenure of offices and that if I am removed by the Chamber of Feoffees and Twenty Men I will offer no opposition to such removal and will thereupon relinquish all claim to the Mastership and its future emoluments and will deliver up to the Feoffees and Twenty Men, or as they may direct, possession of all their property then in my possession or occupation.
