Dear Sir

In accordance with the agreement dated the fourth day of March inst, between R. St. Kingdon Esq (on behalf of himself and the other Trustees of the Colyton Tesser Charity) and Messrs Asa Richards and Samuel Restorick of Colyton, Builders, relative to the value of work done & materials supplied by the said Builders in the erection of a Shed and other Works at Dovehazne Farm, Colyton, for the Trustees of the Colyton Charity, and having met the said R. St. Kingdon, and the said Contractors on the site and having valued the work done I do hereby assess the value of the whole work in the sum of One Hundred and forty seven Pounds and twelve Shillings and I hereby order the Trustees of the Colyton Charity to pay this amount (less any sums (if any) the Contractor or Contractors have been paid on account for these works) within 14 days from this date.
