This Hospital was founded in the year 1738 for the gratuitous reception of Poor Patients from all parts of the United Kingdom, the only conditions being those of poverty, and the suitability of their complaints for the use of the Bath Waters, their stay on the average being 2 months each.

Since the first opening above 54,000 Patients have been admitted, of whom more than 44,000 have been cured or greatly relieved.

The Annual Expenditure of the Hospital amounts to upwards of £4,500, of which not much more than half is derived from funded property, being the accumulation from Legacies and Benefactions: for the remainder the Governors are dependent on Voluntary Contributions.

This is not a mere Local Charity, as there is probably no similar institution in the Kingdom so thoroughly National in its character, or one whose benefits are so widely extended among the suffering Poor.
