

We the undersigned do hereby agree to supply the  
Treasurers of Colyton with Iron piping of 1 1/2 inch bore  
laying and fixing the same with Lead joints at the  
rate of eight pence per foot, for the purpose of con-  
veying the water from the large Tank at the head  
of the Town to a Conduit to be placed at the North  
end of Cap<sup>tn</sup> Powell's Shrubbery in Dusen's Square  
and we farther agree to make, lay, and fix, the  
same piping in a perfect workman like manner  
and that the same piping, Conduit, and taps shall  
be kept in good condition for the space of Twelve  
Months after this piping &c. shall be laid and  
completed free of cost to the Treasurers, and farther  
we agree to have the whole length of piping viz  
570 feet, including the 50 feet already laid down,  
cast, and in perfect readiness for laying down  
on or before the Twenty Second day of this present  
Month November 1851.

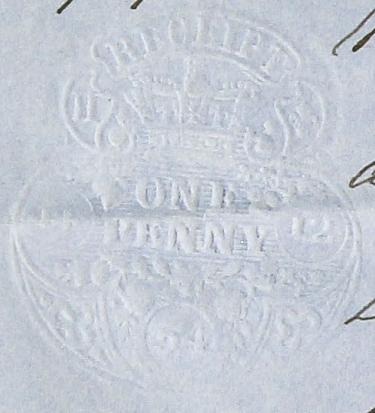
