Dear Sir,

I think it right to furnish the Subscribers with a Statement of the School Account for 1861, and hope the following information respecting the Schools may be generally interesting.

The COLYTON PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS, consisting of Sunday, Night and Day Schools, have been working well during the past year. The *Sunday Schools*, established in 1814, are now well attended and in good order, though the Schoolrooms are hardly large enough for the increased number of children. The conduct in Church is much improved. The Parish is greatly indebted to the Teachers who so kindly give up their time to this good work.

There are about 250 Scholars on the books.

The NIGHT SCHOOLS (Male and Female) have been continued through the winter by the Clergy and Master, with the kind assistance of a few friends.

The average attendance has been about 50.

The DAY SCHOOLS (for Boys and Girls) under Government inspection, was opened in January 1861, under the care of Mr KNIGHT, assisted by Mrs. CHOWN, and two Pupil Teachers.

The number of Scholars for 1861 was—On Books, 170—Average attendance, 111.

Great credit is due to the Master for his earnest and conscientious discharge of his duties. His success and the present efficient state of the Schools are attested by the report just received from H. M. Inspector, which is as follows:—"Discipline and order much improved. The character of the attainments, and of general accuracy, is considerably in advance of that of last year. The Master is hearty and earnest in his work."

These Schools are doing a good work amongst the rising generation in this place, and I earnestly beg my parishioners to give them their countenance and support.
