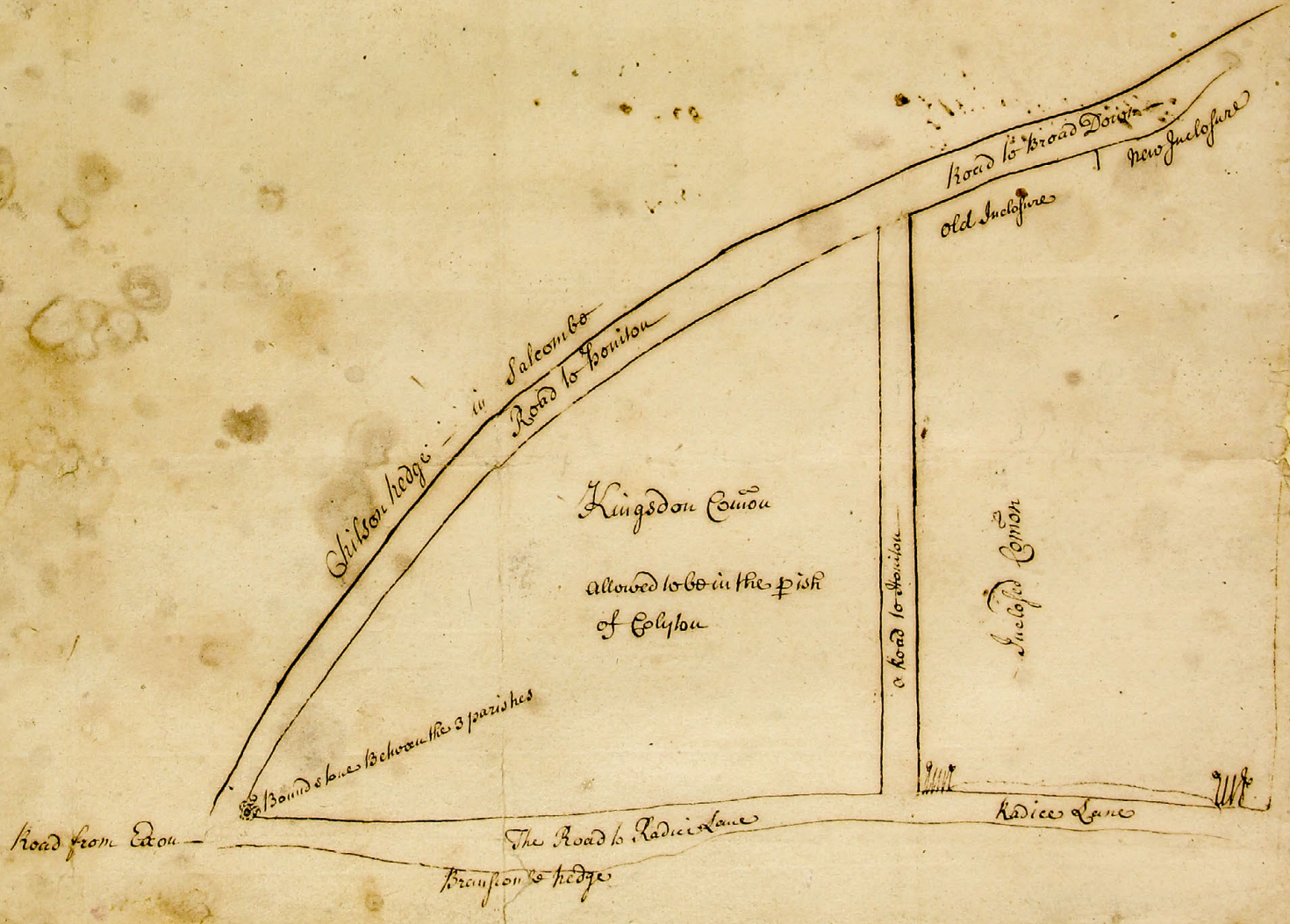


Devon October 4th 1728 A Meeting of Several Gentlemen at Salcombe on a view of Several Roads and Highways touching the repairment of the said Highways, being now in dispute between the Parishes of Culliton and Brandiscomb and Salcombe vizt - to which of the s^d Parishes aforesaid shall repair the said Roads and Highways. There appeared in the behalf of the Parish of Culliton S^r William Pole and Thomas Marwood Esq^r, who did promise and agree to stand by the Determination of George Southcott and Richard Davis Esq^r two Assessors indifferently Chosen to view the said Roads and examine Witnesses on oath and on the Vidimus of the s^d Witnesses to determine to which of the said Parishes it doth or may belong to repair the said Roads and Highways according to Justice and Equity - Robert Stuckey Esq^r and Mr John Carlisle do appear in behalf of the Parish of Brandiscomb and do engage to answer for the said Parish of Brandiscomb and stand by the aforesaid intended determination - Mr Benjamin Mitchell and Mr John Clapp of the Parish of Salcombe do appear in behalf of the said Parish of Salcombe and do engage to answer for the said Parish of Salcombe and stand by the aforesaid intended determination

Nicholas Hill of Braufcombe a Wittness produced and Voluntary Sworn and Examined on the part and behalf of the Parish of Braufcombe as followeth Vizt — That the Road from Youngcombs fall throughout and to the west end of Kingsdon Comon was alwayes reputed and taken to be within the parish of Colyton. But dont remember that the said Road was ever repaired by the said Parish of Colyton or by any person or place whatsoever.

John Cooper a Wittness produced and in like manner sworn on the part of the said Parish of Braufcombe Depoth and sayth That about Twelve years since or upwards his father & Brother cutt sturges on the Brink of the Ditch of Braufcombe hedgs lying against Radies Land and throughout from Youngcombs fall to the west end of Kingsdon Comon by the order and for the use of George Payton who was then the Tenant or occuper of Kingsdon Comon as he hath heard his father say — But does not remember the said Road repaired by the said Parish of Colyton or any other Parish whatsoever.

John Cox of Braufcombe a Wittness produced and in like manner sworn and Examined on the part and behalf of the said Parish of Braufcombe Depoth and sayth That the Road from Youngcombs fall to the end of the New Julofur at Kingsdon Comon being very foundrous and rotten James Pennington the then way-warden of Colyton desired this Depout to cutt the sturges growing in the said Land in order to find out a better Road which this Depout did accordingly and had the sturges for his Labour; It being about five years since

James Pennington of Sedbury a Wittness produced and Voluntary Sworn & Examined on the behalf of the Parish of Colyton Depoth and sayth That the Road in Radies Land from Youngcombs fall to Kingsdon Comon being very much out of Repair about five years since when this Depout was way-warden for the said Parish of Colyton he and his fellow way-wardens were threatened to be punished, whereupon the Depout cutt some sturges and desired one John Cox to cutt other sturges then growing in the said Land in order to make the way more passable But some of the Principall Inhabitants of Colyton hearing of it forbid this Depout to proceed to repair the said Road as not being their Right AND this Depout sayth That he does not remember that the said Road was ever in any other manner repaired by the said Parish of Colyton or any other Parish and this Depout further sayth that about fifty years since one May who destroyed himselfe in the Parish of Braufcombe was by the Inhabitants of Braufcombe buried in Radies Land near Youngcombs fall about five or six feet from the Brink of the Ditch lying against Braufcombs hed of the said Road

William Proser of Colyton a Wittness produced and in like manner sworn & Examined on the part of Colyton Depoth and sayth That about five and sixty years since the way in Radies Land from Youngcombs fall to Kingsdon Comon was very much out of repair And that for the better and more commodious travelling of his Majesties Subjects two breaches were made in the Hedgs of Mr Woolcott lying adjoining to the said Land (Vizt) one near Kingsdon Comon and the other at or near the end of the said Land by Youngcombs fall and lay open for that purpose for Thirty years or upwards which was done by the order & direction of Major Walbond then one of his Majesties Justices of the peace as this Depout hath heard and believes

James Dunnington a Witness produced and voluntarily sworn on the part and behalf of the Parish of Colyton and now on the part of the parish of Salcombe Dapoth and Sayth That a bout five years since this Depout was one of the way-wardens of the Parish of Colyton when the Road leading from Frow to Honiton through Kingdon Common lying against Salcombe hedge was much out of repair This Depout - Concluding the road lay in the Parish of Colyton as being adjoining to Kingdon Common which lay in the said Parish of Colyton He this Depout without the privity of the fellow way-wardens ordered some of the neighbouring Inhabitants of Colyton to carry some Stones to amend the said way and says he believes they did carry two or three Butts of Stones for that purpose.

William Proser a Witness produced sworn and Examined on the part of Colyton and now sworn on the part of Salcombe Dapoth and Sayth That about five years since he being warned by James Dunnington one of the Surveyors of the Roads of Colyton to assist in the repairs of the Roads of Colyton he went out with an Horse or Horses and carried two or three Loads of Stones and laid them in the Road between Fulson hedge and Mr Woolcotts - But says that he does not remember the way which lies open to Kingdon Common was ever repaired by Colyton or any other parish whatsoever

The fourth of October One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty eight Memorandum That upon a View this day taken by us the said Richard Davis and George Southcott Together also with the principall Inhabitants of the severall parishes of Colyton Brauncombe and Salcombe and on hearing the Evidence Allegations and debates of the severall Witnesses and Inhabitants produced by the said severall parishes and also by Mr John Woolcott who hath likewise submitted to the said View and on the Offers Confessions and agreements of the severall persons whose Names are hereunto subscribed and other the principall Inhabitants and persons concerned for the said severall Parishes NOW for composing the differences and Controversies which are arisen and for preventing the disputes and Animosity which are likely to arise between the said parishes and for the sake of Peace Amity and good Accord WE do as much as in us lies determine direct and order That the Inhabitants of the said Parishes of Colyton and Brauncombe do and shall from henceforth repair and amend the Road in Radie Lane from Youngcombs fall to the end of Mr Woolcotts Old Fulsons at the end of the said Lane equally between them in manner following (That is to say) That the said Road shall be measured and divided into two equal parts and proportions in Length and that the Inhabitants of the said Parish of Brauncombe shall repair and amend all that Moyety part of the said Road which lies towards and beginning at Youngcombs fall & so directly westward AND that Colyton Inhabitants do and shall repair the said Road from thence to the end of Mr Woolcotts Old Fulsons AND it is further directed and agreed that a Round stone shall be set up in the middle of the said Lane and another at the end thereof to separate and distinguish the proportions so to be set out and laid on the said severall Parishes and persons concerned in the repair of the said Roads AND it is likewise determined directed and mutually agreed that Mr John Woolcott do and shall repair and amend the said Road from the end of his Old Fulsons at Radie Lane home to the west end of Kingdon Common AND we do hereby further adjudge and determine that the Road lying on the west side of Kingdon Common leading from Salcombe to Honiton beginning at Kingdon Tye and so on by Fulson hedge home to Stuarts gate belongs to the Inhabitants of the said Parish of Colyton and ought to be by them repaired accordingly Except such part thereof as already hath been or shall at any time hereafter be finished (on the Common side) by the said Mr Woolcott or any other person which part of the said Road shall be repaired by the said Mr Woolcott or such person or persons as shall occupy or enjoy the Lands lying near adjoining to such new Fulsons
