in law brought in the Name of any  
of the Feoffees without the consent of  
the rest of them and twenty men under  
the penalty of five pounds. -

The said parish Lands of Colyton or any part thereof or for the rents, houses or profits of the same with Consent of the said Twenty Men and Feoffees or the more part of them that then the said Feoffees or any of them shall not release any such suit or action so preferred or commenced or set forth or be non suit in the same nor shall release any person or persons whatsoever by whom any suit or cause of action may grow before suit be commenced as aforesaid without the Consent of the rest of the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them upon pain of five pounds of Lawfull Money of England by every one making Default over and above the Damage that the parishioners shall and may recover by such release or nonsuit the same to be paid to the parish Baillif to the use of the poor of the said Parish. Also it is agreed between the said parties that if any of the said Feoffees and twenty men at any time from henceforth in any General meeting or conference to be had for or about the said parish Lands or any thing touching or concerning the same shall misbehave himself either in swearing or blaspheming the name of God or in abusing or misusing any person by unseemly words that then every such person and persons so offending shall forfeit and lose to the poor of the parish six pence of current English Money to be paid to the said parish Baillif to the use of the poor aforesaid.

These articles to be read openly  
before any of the parishioners  
who may chuse to attend; and such  
new articles to be made as the  
Feoffees and twenty men shall  
think expedient. -

Also it is further concluded and agreed upon by and between the said parties that it shall and may be lawful from time to time to and for the said Baillif or Baillifs for the time being to levy the said Forfeitures and pains limited and appointed aforesaid by way of Distress to be taken on the goods and chattels of such as shall offend contrary to the said agreements and articles which Distress and Distresses the said Baillif and Baillifs shall and may detain and keep until such pains and Forfeitures so to be lost and Forfeited shall be well and truly satisfied and paid to the use aforesaid.

Also moreover it is agreed upon between the said parties that these articles and such other articles as shall be made hereafter by the said twenty men and Feoffees which now be or hereafter shall be or by the more part of them shall openly be read before the parishioners of Colyton aforesaid or as many of them as list to be present at such convenient time and times as by the said Feoffees and twenty men living or by the more part of them shall be thought meet and convenient and if at any time they think it good new articles to be made and the old to be abolished or reformed as time and occasion shall require and as by the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them shall be thought expedient so that none of them be made contrary to the laws of the land or to the hurt or hindrance of the common good of the parish of Colyton. -

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rest of the said twenty men and Feoffees by the consent of the most of their Voices to dismiss exclude and put out of their Society and Company the said person and persons so being found to be obstinate wilful and insufficient and in his and their place and places to nominate elect and appoint some other meet and sufficient person or persons to supply the place and places of them and each of them so dismissed and excluded.

**A**lso it is likewise agreed between the said parties that if any of the said twenty men which now or hereafter shall happen to be removed that then the person or persons so removed shall no longer be any of the said twenty men but shall be excluded and also from henceforth freed from all Forfeitures pains and penalties which upon him or them might be inflicted by reason of these Articles of Covenants and that whosoever six of the said twenty men shall happen to be removed or die that then six other honest men of the said parish or of such person who either themselves or their parents have Estates in the said parish shall be elected nominated and appointed and put in the place of them so removed or dead by such other of the said twenty men and such of the said Feoffees as shall be then living or the more part of them and that within the space of half a year next and immediately after such removing or Death of the said six upon pain of five Shillings to be paid to the Baillif or Baillifs of the parish Lands of Colyton aforesaid for the Time being to the use of the said parish by every one of the said Feoffees and twenty men then being alive other than such of the same Feoffees and twenty men as shall be able to prove by the Testimony of two credible Witnesses that he or they were present and ready at the Time and place appointed to do his and their Duty in this Election and appointment provided always that warning be given in this Behalf by the Vicar Minister or parish Clerk or Baillif for the Time being as in the fourth Article is before expressed or else no penalty in this Article to be forfeited.

**A**lso it is agreed between the said parties that whosoever the said Feoffees shall come to the Number of three that then the same three Feoffees and the said twenty men or the more part of them for the Time being shall within one Month next after the said Feoffees shall be in Number but three nominate elect and appoint a competent Number of new Feoffees unto whom the three old Feoffees shall by a good and sufficient Conveyance in the Law at the Costs of the parish of Colyton aforesaid within forty Days next following convey and assure all such Lands Tenements and Hereditaments as they the said old Feoffees stand seized of and in trust to the use and Benefit of the aforesaid parish of Colyton to have and to hold the same Lands Tenements and Hereditaments to the said new Feoffees and their Heirs for ever to the same use that the said old Feoffees now stand seized of upon the several pains and penalties hereafter expressed (that is to say) upon pain of twenty Shillings to be paid by every old Feoffee for every week that he or they shall refuse or Detract the Time to do their Duties therein and upon pain of five Shillings to be paid by every of the said twenty men for every week that he or they Neglect their Duty on this Behalf the same pains and Forfeitures to be paid to the said parish Baillif or Baillifs for the Time being to the use of the poor of the said parish and that no person or persons shall at any Time hereafter be admitted to be one of the twenty men before mentioned but only as shall willingly covenant by writing under his or their Hands and Seals to the Feoffees aforesaid truly to observe perform fulfil and keep all and every the articles and agreements in these presents contained according to the purport and true meaning of the same which on his or their parts are or ought to be performed and kept as other the twenty men there now have covenanted and faithfully promised.

**A**lso it is likewise agreed between the said parties that forthwith some honest and discreet person or persons be appointed and compounded withal to do and execute within the aforesaid parish of Colyton these three offices hereafter expressed (viz.) to exercise and execute the Office of Clerk of the Market for and under the authority of the Feoffees of the said parish Lands of Colyton aforesaid and shall execute the same office from Time to Time according to the Laws of the Land and the privileges of the Charter of Colyton aforesaid thereby to preserve and save the Liberties and privileges of the said parish which for want of Execution may be infringed; secondly to keep the Court of pye powders in and during the Fairs which shall be Holden and kept within the said parish of Colyton as is lawful by the Letters patent of Colyton aforesaid and as is also in other Fairs used and accustomed; and thirdly to be a Notary to register and keep a Book of all such Material Matters and Things as shall be at any Time hereafter concluded and agreed upon in any Conference and Meeting between the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them for whose pains and travail in this Behalf the said person or persons so to be appointed shall have such yearly Fee and allowance as he or they may be reasonably agreed withal by the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them.

**A**lso it is likewise agreed upon by the said parties that if any Suit or action in the Law shall at any time hereafter be commenced preferred or set forth against any person or persons whatsoever in the Name of the said Feoffees of the parish Lands of Colyton or in the Name of any of them for any Matter or Cause whatsoever

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follows (vizt) Neighbours this Day after Evening service or such a Day a Conference is to be had about the leasing or letting of such a Tenement or such a piece of ground lying in such a place being of the parish Lands at which Conference you that be Feoffees and twenty men ought to be present.

5<sup>th</sup> Strangers to have access freely to offer and bargain for such things as then are to be letten leased or granted for the Benefit of the said parish and where also the residue of the said parishioners of Colyton being neither the Feoffees or twenty Men may hear and see what is done in that Behalf wherein they also may give their advise and consent about the leasing or letting thereof (if need so require) or to make offer for Estates or those things which are then there to be leased or granted and the best = Chapman to be heard.

6<sup>th</sup> Five Shillings penalty on Feoffees refusing to sign any lease &c. Also it is agreed between the said parties that no Lease or Grant hereafter to be made of any part or parcel of the said parish Lands to any person or persons whatsoever either for a Term of life or lives Year or Years or otherwise but only at the public Meeting above mentioned and that also by the general Consent of the most part of the said Feoffees and the most part of the said twenty Men and that such an Estate or Lease so granted the said Feoffees and every of them within one and twenty Days next after request unto them to be made by the buyer thereof shall sign seal and deliver as their Deed so as it be exhibited and offered unto them in writing made in due form of Law and according to their Agreements and upon reasonable Covenants upon a pain of five Shillings for every week to be paid by every of the said Feoffees which shall refuse so to seal and deliver the same which Forfeiture and pain is to be paid to the Bailliff or Bailli of the parish Lands aforesaid to the use and Behoof of the poor of the said parish and that every such lease so to be made shall be indented the Counterpart of which shall forthwith after the sealing thereof be put into the aforesaid place appointed for keeping the Charter and Writings aforesaid there to be kept.

7<sup>th</sup> If any Feoffee and twenty men shall make any Lease or Grant contrary to the 6<sup>th</sup> article, to forfeit five pounds and the value of the thing so leased. Also it is agreed between the said parties that if any of the said Feoffees and twenty Men shall at any time hereafter take upon him or them to make any Lease or Leases grant or Grants of any of the said parish Lands to any person or persons contrary to the true Meaning and Intent of the former Article that then the said person or persons so offending and every of them shall Forfeit and pay to the Bailliff or Bailli of the said parish Lands of Colyton for the time being the sum of five pounds of current English Money and also the value of the thing so leased or granted being valued as it shall be worth to be sold the same Forfeitures to be to the use and Behoof of the poor of the aforesaid parish according to the Direction of the rest of the said Feoffees and twenty Men or the more part of them.

8<sup>th</sup> No sum to be disturbed without the consent of the most part of the Feoffees and twenty men under the penalty of double the value of such sum. Also it is agreed between the said parties that if any of the said Feoffees or twenty Men shall obstinately wilfully or unadvisedly take upon him or them to convert and bestow the said rents revenues and sume of Money to any use or uses without the Consent or Direction of the most part of the said Feoffees and twenty Men thereunto first had and obtained that then such person and persons so offending and every of them shall forfeit and pay unto the Bailliff or Bailli of the said parish Lands of Colyton for the time being double the value of such Money as by them or any of them shall be so converted and bestowed the which Money so forfeited shall be bestowed to the use and Behoof of the poor people of the parish of Colyton according to the Direction of the rest of the said Feoffees and twenty Men by the consent of the most part of them.

9<sup>th</sup> attendance to be given by every Feoffee and twenty men under the penalty of two shillings and six pence each. Also it is likewise agreed between the said parties that every of the said Feoffees and twenty Men shall from time to time upon Notice or warning given to them or left in writing at their respective Habitations or Dwellinghouses give his and their diligent attendance and travail for the leasing or letting of the said parish Lands aforesaid for the good ordering or well employing the revenues and profits coming and growing of the same upon the pain of paying and forfeiting two shillings and six pence a piece by every of them from time to time making Default to be paid to the Bailliff or Bailli of the said parish Lands of Colyton for the time being to the use of the poor of the same parish except sickness or any great cause shall let him or them to do his or their endeavours therein the same let or sickness to be adjudged by the rest of the Feoffees and twenty Men.

10<sup>th</sup> Such of the twenty men as shall be obstinate or insufficient or to be dismissed and others elected. Also it is agreed between the said parties that if any of the said twenty men which now are or which at any time hereafter shall be nominated elected and appointed shall at any time shew themselves to deal contrary to the trust in them reposed or to be insufficient obstinate or wilfull inclined to serve their own assertions and will not be tractable nor yield their consent to such good order as from time to time shall be thought most meet and convenient for the Benefit and Behoof of the parish of Colyton aforesaid according to the good liking of the most part of the rest of the said twenty men and Feoffees that then it shall and may be lawful to and for

<sup>1<sup>st</sup></sup> repository for the Charter and other writings under three Keys.  
 At the first place it is agreed between the said parties that the Charter of the purchase of the Manor of Colyton aforesaid and all other Deeds and writings belonging to the parish Lands and Accounts of the said Parish shall forthwith be put into such convenient place as shall be by the said parties or most part of them thought fit and safe for the keeping and preserving of them from spoil and spoil of evil persons and other casual accidents there to be kept under three Locks and three Keys To the use of the parishioners of the said Parish of Colyton that now be or which hereafter shall for evermore of the which Keys one shall remain in the custody of the said Feoffees and the two Keys in the several custodies of such of the said twenty men as shall be thought most convenient by the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them.

<sup>2<sup>nd</sup></sup> parish Baillif chosen yearly on Wednesday after Easter and Duty of his office.  
 Also it is agreed between the said parties that for the receiving of the rents Fines Casualties and profits of all the parish Lands of Colyton aforesaid one or two Baillifs or Baillifs shall be elected and chosen yearly the Wednesday next after Easter Day by the said Feoffees and twenty men and the more part of them the said Feoffees and twenty men for the time being which said Baillif or Baillifs shall continue and execute the said office one whole year or longer time if it shall be so thought good and convenient by the said Feoffees and twenty men or the most part of them and the said Baillif or Baillifs agreeing whereof the same Baillif or Baillifs shall also once every year in which he or they shall be Baillif or Baillifs view all and singular the said parish Lands of Colyton to see whether any Waste Spoil or Decay or other material Thing to be found in or upon any of the said Lands and if any Waste Spoil or Decay or other material Thing to be found in or concerning the said Lands in prejudice of the parishioners of Colyton aforesaid to signify the same to the said Feoffees and twenty men the next Sunday following after such waste decay or other material Thing so found to the end that speedy information of such abuse may be had which said Baillif or Baillifs shall have such yearly fee and allowance for their service in and about the execution of his or their said office as other Baillif or Baillifs heretofore have had or more if it shall be thought good by the said Feoffees and twenty men or the more part of them.

<sup>3<sup>d</sup></sup> parish Baillif to give a Bond and his accounts yearly to be rendered within twenty eight Days of Easter.  
 Also it is agreed between the said Baillif or Baillifs from time to time so to be elected and chosen before he or they shall intermeddle or have to do with his or their said office enter into a Bond to one of the said Feoffees or to one of the said twenty men or to both in such a sufficient sum of Money as shall be equal to his or their receipts to bring in and give up unto such Auditors as shall be appointed a perfect and true Account of all and singular the Revenues rents profits Casualties or such sums of Money as shall come to his or their hands or which he or they may receive without suit of Law and that the same accounts shall yearly be made and delivered to the said Auditors within eight and twenty Days after Easter Day which said accounts the said Auditors shall receive peruse and cast up who finding any Defect faults or error therein shall further make the same known unto the said Baillif or Baillifs to the end that the said Baillif or Baillifs may reform and amend the same and thereupon the said Baillif or Baillifs shall within forty Days after Easter Day yearly so long as he or they shall be Baillif or Baillifs level and clear his or their accounts for the year past before so many of the said Feoffees and twenty men as shall be present which said accounts so being audited perfected levelled and cleared the said Feoffees and twenty men having the keys of the place appointed for keeping the said Charter and writings shall lay up and put into the same place there to remain to be seen at all times of occasion so required and the surplus of Money remaining due upon every such account shall forthwith be paid and delivered to such Treasurer as shall be appointed in that behalf.

<sup>4<sup>th</sup></sup> No leave to be granted before Conference and meeting in the Church or Church yard.  
 Also it is agreed between the said parties that before any Lease or Grant of any of the said Parish Lands of Colyton shall pass or be letten to any person or persons whatsoever that the said Feoffees or twenty men or the most part of them shall at some convenient time or times meet and confer together about the granting Leasing or letting thereof to consider of the same and therein to give their advise and counsele which shall be fittest to be done in that behalf of which meeting and conference so to be had the vicar Minister or parish Clerk for the time being or the Baillif for the time being shall give warning in the church or church yard after morning Mass in this sort or the like.
