

Agreement made of the Parish Lands
of Colyton

All Owe and late in the tenure of William Drake and now in the tenure of Adam Clark and Mary Colman or their Assigns and now in the possession of Henry Clark Doctor **And Also** all that
 Mesnage or Burbage with its appurtenances in Abington aforesaid and sometime heretofore in the tenure of Philip Colman and late in the tenure of John Turberville Drury that of John Llywelyn Gonfoman and
 now in the possession of the said Hooftes or of their Assigns **And Also** all that Mesnage or Burbage with its appurtenances in Abington aforesaid sometime heretofore in the tenure or occupation of Lawrence Doctor and
 late that of John Clapp and now in the tenure of George King or his Assigns **And Also** all those Mesnages lands Common rents curtilages borrows and hereditaments wheresoever with the appurtenances thereto
 lying and being in the Parish of Sidbury in the County aforesaid sometime heretofore in the tenure of Richard Drakes and late in the tenure of John Drakes or his Assigns **And Also**
 all those lands and tenements with the appurtenances in Colyton aforesaid called Drakes Lane sometime heretofore in the tenure of Sir William Pole Knight deceased and late in the tenure of Lady Anne Pole also deceased and now in
 the tenure of Sir John Pole Baronet or his Assigns **And Also** all that Mesnage or Curtilage or Dicolling House whereon Richard Drorwell Blacksmith lately dwelt and all houses and curtilages gardens and Closes of land thereto adjoining
 with the appurtenances containing by estimation one Burbage of Land or more or less situated lying and being in the Burrough of Elyford aforesaid and bounded with the high way leading from Colyton towards Colyton in
 the West a Lane leading to a part of Land late of one Robert Dolbear on the North the Land of Humphrey Goad Esquire in the East and the high Way or Street there on the South and more formerly in the tenure or occupation
 of the said Richard Drorwell Blacksmith late that of Ralph Lillor or his Assigns late that of John Speed deceased but now in the possession of the said Hooftes **And Also** all that one other Lot of Land with the appurtenances
 containing by estimation one Burbage and half a Burbage of Land or more or less situated lying and being in the said Burrough of Elyford aforesaid between the Lands of the Livers of Thomas Horsham late in the possession
 of one Richard Shitter on the West the high Way or Street there on the North the Lands of John Arundell of Erre Esquire and William Collins of Colman on the East and the Lands of the Livers of
 Wardham tall and
 Bowling Lane on the South late in the tenure of the said Richard Drorwell and of Henry Drader and William Blansheller their or one of their Assigns or Assigns and also all woods underwood trees hedges ditches paths ways
 Easements waters watercourses Commons profits and tenements wheresoever so called singular and pecuniary as aforesaid or to any part or parts thereof in any wise belonging or appertaining
 and the rents reversiones and services of all and singular the premises aforesaid with the appurtenances together with all deeds charters evidences and writings whatsoever concerning the said premises only or only partly
 part or parts thereof all which last mentioned premises lying in Colyton aforesaid were heretofore purchased at the cost of Walter Yonge Esquire deceased **To DANE AND TO HOLD** all and singular
 the said Mesnages lands Common rents curtilages borrows and hereditaments and all and singular other the before mentioned premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas
 Drake Ellis Verjard Francis Bratt Thomas Speed Beauchamp Marwood William Balme and William Sampfield late of Colyton Thomas Drakins John Drakins and Edward Drake their heirs and Assigns
 for evermore **UPON TRUST** and to such persons as he shall then be and to the uses intents and pur poses hereafter expressed and limited that is to say **THE TRUST** that the clear yearly sum of five pounds of lawful money
 of England of the rents revenues issues and profits of all the said premises except the lands at Daynton otherwise known in the parish of Shute and the premises purchased and had of the gift and bequest of the
 said Walter Yonge in Elyford aforesaid shall be yearly employed and bestowed to and for the maintenance and keeping of a School within the Town of Colyton aforesaid to have and continue for ever the Schoolmaster for the same
 to be from time to time chosen nominated and elected by the said Hooftes and twenty men of the said Parish of Colyton for the time being or the most part of them as now are or hereafter shall be chosen elected or put in trust for the same
 Utility and profit of the Parishioners of the said Parish to namely taught or known by the name of the twenty men and by them again upon any lawful or just occasion to be dismissed and dispensed and by none else and
 that the residue of the rents issues revenues issues and profits yearly tenuing growing arising and receiving of in or upon the aforesaid premises except before granted after raising of the said yearly sum of five pounds shall
 be expended employed and bestowed to such good godly and sum moneable purposes and goods of Charity as from time to time shall seem most and convenient unto such Hooftes and twenty men of the said Parish of Colyton for the
 time being or the most part of them as aforesaid **AND IN THIS** that the clear yearly sum of five pounds of lawful money out of the rents issues and profits of the said Mesnage and premises in Daynton otherwise
 known in Shute aforesaid shall be paid by quarterly payments to the said Schoolmaster for teaching instructing and bringing up in learning five sons of the poor boys of the said Parish of Colyton whose parents shall
 not be well able to maintain them at the said School as the said Hooftes and twenty men of the said Parish or the major part of them for the time being shall nominate put to school and appoint the said School
 master for the time being to teach and instruct and that the residue of the rents and profits of the said Mesnage and premises shall be from time to time disposed of in such manner and for such publick uses of the said Parish of Colyton
 as the said Hooftes and twenty men of the said Parish shall think fit to order and appoint and that the rents issues and profits of the excepted lands in Elyford shall be paid yearly for ever for and towards the houses rents of
WHICH poor people of Colyton and Elyford aforesaid as the said Hooftes and twenty men of the said Parish of Colyton or the more part of them for the time being shall appoint **AND WHEREAS** the said John Drakins
 the grandfather at the time of his death stood and was seized in his Domus as of his by Copy of Court Roll according to the custom of the Manor of Shute Saint Mary in the said County of Devon of and in one Mesnage
 and eight Acres of Land with the appurtenances in Shute Saint Mary aforesaid of the tenure of freehold under the yearly rent of three shillings **AND ALSO** of one other Mesnage and one Acre of Land of freehold
 lying at Lippisill foot under the yearly rent of seven pence **AND ALSO** of two Acres of Land of the same tenure lying at Alphington under the yearly rent of eight pence and which was in trust for the Hooftes and twenty men
 of the said Parish of Colyton and the said Indenture preceding is now intituled to the said Coppishold premises adjoin to the said grand father **TO WHOM IS INDEBTEDNESS** that the said man
 bearing dons heretby for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators and for the said Susanna his wife to whom he promiseth and agrees to and will in the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drakins his heirs
 and Assigns that she the said Susanna bearing shall and will at any time or times hereafter at the reasonable request cost and charges of them the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drakins Francis Marwood William Sampfield the late Thomas Drakins John Drakins and Edward Drake their heirs
 and Assigns be admitted to the said Coppishold premises and afterwards yearly and absolutely surrendered and恢e into the hands of the Lord or Lovers of the said Manor of Shute Saint Mary aforesaid or of his or their Heirs there for the
 time being according to the custom of the said Manors all and singular the same Coppishold premises with their and every of their appurtenances and all her estate right title and interest of a man in the same and of in and to

WITI part and parcell thereof with the appurtenances To the end and intent that the same may be immediately granted unto them the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drake
 Ellis Veryard Francis Bratt Item as speed bend in his maner William Sampfield the elder, & Thomas Dossins John Bailey & Edward Squire their heirs and Assigns for ever according to this custome
 of this said Mannor And it is agreed by and betwixt the said partyes to these presents and it is the true intent and meaning hereof that from and immediately after such Survey and
 grant shall be made as aforesaid the rents, dues and profits of the same Celyghton premises shall be expended employed and bestowed to such good godly and commendable purposes and deeds of
 Charite as from time to time shall seem most and convenient unto the said Heffees and the said twenty men of the said parish of Colyton for the time being or the most part of them as aforesaid and to the
 intent that the said dissevered tenements and all accouninges the premises hereby granted be intended so to be may continue remaine and be enjoyed to and for the uses trusts intents and purposes
 hereinbefore mentioned and expressed they the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drake Ellis Veryard Francis Bratt Item as speed bend in his maner William Sampfield the elder, Thomas Dossins John Bailey
 and Edward Squire do agree for themselves severally and respectively and for their severall and respective Heirs Executors and Administrators and not the one for the others or for the others Executors or
 Administrators of the others reversionary promises and Agree to and with the said Thomas Starwood and Philip Michell their & theirs Executors and Administrators by these presents in manner and form
 following That is to say that they the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drake Ellis Veryard Francis Bratt Item as speed bend in his maner William Sampfield the elder, Thomas Dossins John Bailey
 and Edward Squire any or either of them or their or either of their Heirs shall not nor will at any time hereafter sett forth give grant or demise the aforesaid premises or any of them or any part or parcell thereof
 to any person or persons whatsoever otherwise than shall be from time to time directed and appointed by the said Heffees and twenty men of the parish of Colyton aforesaid or the more part of them for the
 time being and further when and at such time as the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drake Ellis Veryard Francis Bratt Item as speed bend in his maner William Sampfield the elder, Thomas Dossins John Bailey
 and Edward Squire shall by death or otherwise be reduced to the number of three then such three remaining Heffees shall upon reasonable request to them to be made in that behalfe by the said Twenty men of
 the said parish of Colyton or the major part of them for the time being Surveyor the said Celyghton premises and convey and assure all the aforesaid premises and every part and parcell thereof with all curvages
 singulars there appurtenances in such ordene manner and form and into such other person and persons of the parish of Colyton aforesaid who either themselves or their parents have estates in the said
 parish as shall be nominated and appointed by the said Surveyor Heffees and twenty men for the time being or the more part of them to the like uses intents and purposes as is before mentioned and
 declared in this present Indenture and to none other **IN** the said Thomas Starwood and Philip Michell have constituted appointed and in their places and by these presents doth constitute appoint and
 in their places put William Berry of Colyton aforesaid fuller and Isaac Elman of the same place Barber both of Colyton aforesaid their true and lawfull Attorneys specially and severally for them and
 in their name and stead into the said granted premises or into some part or parcell thereof in the name of the whole to enter and possess and be in there of or of some part thereof in the
 name of the whole to take and possession and be in there of or of some part thereof in the name of the whole to take and after possession and be in there of so had and taken payable possession
 and be in there of or of some part thereof in the name of the whole to deliver into the said John Sampson William Sampfield Thomas Drake Ellis Veryard Francis Bratt Item as speed bend in his maner William Sampfield the elder,
 Thomas Dossins John Bailey and Edward Squire or to one of them to the use of them all or their heirs and Assigns according to the ten purport and meaneing of this present
 Indenture ratifying allowing and holding firme all and whatsoeuer their said Attorneyes or either of them shall do in the premises by Virtue and force of these presents **IN WITNESSE**
 whereof his parties above named to these present Indentures their several hands and seals interchangably have sett **A. 1601** the day and year first above written


