released and for ever quitte claymed unto William
Drake and John Abbott all my right title clayme
interest and demand whatsoever w^{ch} of the said
Thomas Whitker now have or hath or for tyme
to come I my exors & or Admors & or either of
them may or might have or clayme to have of
me or to all that Messuagi or Tenants in Dolyton
aforesaid commonly called or knowne by the name
of Whittley containing by estimation seven
acres together with the appurtenances, soe that neither
I the said Thomas Whitker my exors & or Admors
any right, title, or demand whatsoever thereunto
or to any part or part thereof shall for ever hereafter
hereafter clayme, but therefrom shall and will
be debarred for ever by these presents. In Witnesse
whereof I the said Thomas Whitker have sett
my hand & seal the one and twentieth day of
December in the six and twentieth year of the
reigne of Kinge Charles the second Annoq^{ue} Domⁱⁿⁱ
1674.
