 hath the day of the date hereof for and in consideration of the sum of ffoure
 pounds of lawfull money to him in hand payd by the above named William
 Drake and John Abbott, released and quit claymed unto the said William
 Drake and John Abbott for the use of the benefice of the parish of Dolyton aforesaid
 all his right title clayme and demand of in or to all that Messuagi and
 Tenent in Dolyton aforesaid commonly called or knowne by the name of Whicker
 containing by estimation Seven acres together wth their and every and either
 of their appurtenances as by the said release more at large appeareth. Now if the
 above bounden Thomas Whicker his executor admist and assignor and
 every and either of them doe and shall from tyme to tyme and all all tymes
 hereafter duringe the life of our William Whicker of Dolyton aforesaid husband
 grant and suffer the said William Drake and John Abbott and their assignors
 peaceably and quietly to have hold use occupy possesse and enjoy all the said
 Tenent wth their appurtenances wth out the lett, molestacion denyall, or interruption
 of or by the said Thomas Whicker his executor admist or assignor. And alsoe
 if the said Thomas Whicker doe before the five and twentieth day of this
 instant month of December together wth his wife and mayde servant
 depart and leave the said parish of Dolyton and goe and inhabite in the parish
 of Aquistox (beinge their owne parish) that then this obligation to be voyed
 or else to remaine and be in full power and vertue. / the marks of
