


His Indenture made the eleventh and day of October in the eighteenth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles the second by the grace of God of England  
 Scotland France and Ireland & Liege founder of the faith etc. Between Sir Walter Younge of Colyton in the County of Devon Baron William Drake and Edward Drake  
 of Colyton aforesaid gentleman and John Abbott of Colyton aforesaid yeoman of the aforesaid lands Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis  
 Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller feoffees of the said lands of Colyton aforesaid of the other party Whereas  
 the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott by and with the consent of the feoffees and tenantry of the said lands of Colyton aforesaid  
 by an indenture bearing date the thirteenth and twentieth day of February in the seventeenth year of the reign of the said King Charles the second made between them  
 Stoning of Honyton in the said County of Devon Damer of the one part and the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott of the other part for  
 the consideration of the sume of three hundred and fiftie pounds in the said indenture mentioned and purchased and acquired unto them the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake  
 Edward Drake and John Abbott and their heirs and assigns from the said Christopher Stoning And the said Christopher Stoning by the said indenture did bargaine sell distesse and confine unto  
 them the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott their heirs and assigns all that Messuage and Tenement with appurtenances situated lyinge and beinge at Haympton  
 in the parish of Shute in the said County of Devon then in the tenure possession or occupancy of the said Christopher Stoning his Compe and assigns And all and  
 singular houses edifices buildings courtyards gardens orchards meadows pastures feedings trees woodes in woodes wayes paths waterways easements  
 commodities emoluments advantages and hereditamts in that place in Haympton or Shute or elsewhere unto the said Messuage and Tenement or any parte thereof belonginge or  
 in anywise what staynges or tenns or therfore accepted taken or knowne or used occupied or enioyed to exercice or number therof or by right of inheritance And otherwise  
 the rents and issues remainder and remanente thereof or of ex parte thereof And all the said Christopher Stoning estate right title in itt staynges and demanentes wherover  
 of in ex parte the said Messuage or in ex parte thereof land or pasture commonly called or knowne by the name of the great Ham tounayng by estimation there  
 of to the same more or lesse lately sold and conveyed by the said Christopher Stoning unto John Hony some of Nicholas Dray of Shute aforesaid yeoman under a certaine yeare  
 rent which was also granted and conveyed by the said Christopher Stoning unto the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott their heirs and assigns for  
 ever only excepted and purpuised to have and to hold the aforesaid Messuage and Tenement and all other the premises in all and every this appurtenance except before excepted unto  
 the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott their heirs and assigns for evermore as in and by the said indenture doth amongst divers other things  
 therein contained more fully appear to saye unto the said Messuage and Tenement was in truth made by the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John  
 Abbott to the said Christopher Stoning of the said lands and tennies of the said feoffees of the said lands affordinge convenienties of maintenance unto the said  
 feoffees by the said Sir Walter Younge of Colyton aforesaid Robert and Edward Drake deceased to the said Christopher Stoning should inherite it in lands to use for the teachinge of fine  
 poor Schollars of that place and on other p[ro]p[ri]etye whereof he said Sir Walter Younge giveth to these points to and for the same use intent and purpose and the  
 residue thereof was rayed out of the issues and profits of other the said lands of the said place and the same were in the appurtenance and the rents issues  
 and profits thereof are to yes and no man to further uses intent and purpos for the benefit of the said place as heretofore in these points are expressed and declared Now to the intent  
 that the said purchased lands and possessions may be settled accordingly **Business** these points that the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John  
 Abbott and to the tennies rents and possessions of the said place aliened bargained and sold in fee simple and confirmed and by these points doth alien bargaine sell in fee simple and confirm unto the said  
 Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller their heirs  
 and assigns for ever All that the aforesaid Christopher Stoning lands tennies rents issues and possessions with their issues every of their appurtenances excepted **To have and to hold the**  
 same unto them their heirs and assigns for ever to the use of them the said Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell  
 John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller now feoffees of the said lands of Colyton aforesaid their heirs and assigns for ever upon payment of yearly rent  
 and to the intents and purpos of hereafter expressed and declared and not otherwise and to no other intent or purpose whatsoever that is to say to the intent that they the said Robert Farrant  
 Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller and their successors  
 of the said lands and purpos for the yearly payment shall yearly from hence to time to come for ever hereafter receive and take the rents issues and profits of the said Messuage lands convenientlye  
 hereby named or intended to be conuied and shall dispossess and expell the same as here after followeth that is to say that they the said feoffees and their successors shall for ever hereafter yearly pay or  
 transfer to the said Christopher Stoning of the School of Colyton aforesaid and to his successors Schoolmaster of the said School as longe as he or they shall be and continue Schoolmaster of  
 the said School and shall alwaies and without any other reward teach instruct and bringe up in learninge by the best meanes he and they can finde such of the poor boyes of the said place of Colyton whose parents  
 shall not be well able to paye them at the said School as the said feoffees for each in the eventure of the said place for the same beinge shall nominate thise and certifie to the School and deffire and  
 appoint him and them the said Christopher Stoning for the same to teach and instruct the full sume of fiftie pounds yearly and every year for ever the same to be payed to him and them quarterly in every year  
 by even pounds over and above the sume paid by the said Christopher Stoning for the said Christopher Stoning and his Successors by the said feoffees and tenantry of the said place And shall continue from h[er]e to tyme  
 to tyme of the rest and residue of the said rents issues and profits of the said Messuage lands rents issues and profits to be received by the said feoffees from tyme to tyme in such manner and for such p[er]iodes  
 of the said place of Colyton as the said feoffees and tenantry of the said place shall think fit to ordene and appoint the same and at the other place of the said place of Colyton aforesaid of And to the  
 said feoffees and tenantry to tyme to tyme to be the more convenientlye done at aforesaid It is hereby mutuallye consented concluded and agreed by and betwixt all the said feoffees to these points that now feoffees  
 shall from tyme to tyme as need shall require be chosen and made of and for the said feoffees amounts made and given thereto and all other charges touching the said place shall be done and caused for ever  
 hereafter by the said feoffees thereof for the tyme as shall and ought to be with the other place of the said place for the good of the said place and for the truste and intentes aforesaid **Item** it is further  
 consented concluded and agreed upon by and betwixt the said feoffees to these points that in order to the chusinge of new feoffees as aforesaid they the said Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter  
 Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller doe severally and respectively each of them for him  
 selfe and his heirs to and with the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott their heirs and assigns by these points that all such tyme as th[er]e shall be but three persons of them  
 the said Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller livinge that they  
 the said place livinge beinge but three in number shall upon request unto them to be made by the tenantry of Colyton aforesaid more livinge as with her shall be or the most part of them give  
 grant on behalf and to say unto such other persons and their heirs and assigns for ever at the said tyme or tyme or the most part of them for the same to be nominated to consist all the said Messuage  
 and tenement in that place (except before excepted) and every p[er]t and profit thereof the same to be payed to the said feoffees as are before mentioned and declared in and by these points and to no other intent  
 and purpos of whatsoever **Item** the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott do for themselves severally and respectively and not one for the other and for their several and respective  
 heirs grant that all the said Messuage and tenement and all and singular the premises to all and singular the premises except before excepted by them the said Sir Walter Younge William  
 Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott and their several and respective heirs unto the said Robert Farrant Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell  
 John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller and their heirs for ever according to the law intent and meaning of these points shall and will remaine antiquit and for ever defend by these  
 points **Item** lastly the said Sir Walter Younge William Drake Edward Drake and John Abbott have made constituted and arrayed and in their place putt John Smith and Robert Lynn of Haympton  
 aforesaid all and singular their true and lawfull Attorneyes severally into the said premises and to them to deliver unto the said Robert Farrant  
 Peter Blakelar Walter Vye Richard Norton Francis Bagwell Peter Dicken Phillip Mitchell John Haffson John Whitcher John Basleigh and Peter Seller according to the law intent and meaning of these  
 points ratifyinge allonges and confirminge all and whatsoever their said Attorneyes or either of them shall do in the premises by these points **In Business** wherof the saids aforesaid  
 have to th[er]e feoffees to be done in the said place the same to be done in the said place
