

his Indenture Made by & between the date of April in the yeare of our souaigne lord James by the grace of God of England ffraunce & Irelond Kinge, Defendor of the ffrithes & the one & twentie and of Scotland the sixe and fyfthe. **Betweene**
 ffrauncis Bagwell of Colton in the County of Devon xeman of thone xl. And Joseph Long, John Sampson sen, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill Younger, James Garswill gentilmen, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn holder, John Holwill e
 Edward Bagwell xeman of Colton aforesaid of Colton xl. **WITNESSETH** hat wchitac's ffrauncis Bagwell now is esdandt lawfully seded as ffrauncis & by copy of Court Rolls according to the custome of the manor of Otry & Maner
 in his said County of Devon &c in diverse messuages lands & tenements with their appurtenances situated lyeng and being in the said Custome of Otry & Maner aforesaid in his said County of Devon w^t George Stockbridge gent, Edward Drak, John Etchland holder, Walter Morris
 Walter Weston, Richard ffrauncant, George Marty and John Weston his younger of Wilhavyn now deceased together with his said ffrauncis Bagwell. By reason of a gifte surrendre of one John Morris of ffrauncayne w^t in the said
 of Colton aforesaid, As by his recyng of two of Attorney concurring hisame Surrender made att large at his maye apperance. All vs of said messuages lands and tenementes w^t in his said County by the dea^t of George Stockbridge, Edward Drak, John Etchland
 holder, Walter Morris, Walter Weston, Richard ffrauncant, George Marty and John Weston his younger of Wilhavyn also none lawfully come unto his said ffrauncis Bagwell by right of Succession. And forasmuch as it is evident & manifest as well to his said
 ffrauncis Bagwell, as also to other the inhabitants and xemans of his said Towne and ffeoffes of Colton, that sylf psone ad yenteisance haue beene ffraffed or tenants of his said lands & tenements were appointed of trust, and haue not all any tyme taken the benefit & condicione
 of hisame to hem owne parbale vs, but that the rents issud & profitt therof vertely usyng comyng & growyng roght by ffrauent consent & agreement of his more xl or bettre sort of his said Towne committed employed & bestowed to god & goddes comendable purpote &
 dede of maner. That is to say, either for finding of a Schoolmaster for the god & bretchous education & bringyng upp of chyldeyn in learning, for the spedis setting forth & furnyshing of Soldiern to serue the Prince in tyme of warres, for the wellesse & succour of
 poore, and & impotent person, and for the retayning and amending of bridges & high wayes within his said ffeoffe and other god & charitables dede to be disposed & expended ad occasion shalbe shewen, and as it shalbe stemed most meet & convenient for the common utilite & profit of his said
 Towne of Colton aforesaid. **Therefore** hat his said ffrauncis Bagwell at his speciall instance request and desire affred of his said Joseph Long, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill, James Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John
 Holwill & Edward Bagwell, as also of diverse other god & well disposed xemans of his said ffeoffe of Colton. And having a god loue reale & affection towards his said ffeoffe and withall talkynge to his remembraunce he truste & confidant before his tyme in him deposid concerning his disposing
 of his rents and profitts of his said lands & tenements **both** nowe by his psone written p[ro]misse graunt and agree for hemself his spoues executors administrators & assignes to and with his said Joseph Long, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill,
 James Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John Holwill and Edward Bagwell and curay of hem, haue stured executors & assignes and h[er]aldes executors and assignes of curay of hem. That hee his said ffrauncis Bagwell his spoues or assignes before his death
 & Michaelmas daye shalbe mettysing after his deth seyses upon reasonable request to hym to be made shalbe & will clearly and absolutely Surrender and yeld upp into his hands of the lord or lordes of his said manor of Otry & Maner aforesaid or of god or spirit
 Eteward h[er]re for his tyme being, according to the custome of his said manor. And all his said messuages lands & tenements and other his ffeoffes before recyd & specyfied with all & singuler hem appurtenances. As also his estate title & interest of in & to hisame and of
 in and to curay of his spoues. To trust and behafe of his said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John Holwill and Edward Bagwell h[er]aldes executors & assignes
 for ever. **And in Consideracion** of hisame Surrender so to be made, and to his intent and purpote that his rents issud & profitts of his said lands & tenements maye from henceforth be ymployed & bestowed to sute and the like uses as arre before recyd. **And**
 Joseph Long, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill, James Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John Holwill and Edward Bagwell being nowe also appointed and nomynated to stand shalbe of his said lands & tenements only of trust & confidence.
 Doe godemat p[ro]misse graunt & agree sevally and resp[on]sibillitie each of hym for hemself his spoues executors administrators & assignes by his p[ro]mise in manner & forme following, that is to say, that
 hee his said Joseph Long, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill, James Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John Holwill and Edward Bagwell nowe any one of hym will not all any tyme hereafter giv[en], graunte, demise, sett, surrendre or
 yeld upp his said lands or tenements or any p[ar]te or p[ar]ce thereof to any p[erson] or p[erson] other than shalbe hym selfe and appoynted by the direction of his Twentie men of Colton aforesaid nowe beynge or w[ill] beynge heire or the most xl of hym, and that his rents issud & profitts
 of his said messuages lands & tenements vertely usyng commyng & growyng shall not be bestowed ymployed or disposed att any tyme hereafter without ffrauent, consent or agreement of his said Twentie men or the most xl of them for his tyme beynge be yelbownd. **And**
 that att such tyme as there shalbe but two or three p[erson] of them his said Joseph Long, John Sampson, ffrauncis Weston, Robert ffrauncant, John Garswill, Walter Marty, Thomas ffraunclyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell living, That then by
 his said p[erson] living beynge but two or three in number shall upon reasonable requeste unto them to be made in hat shalbe by his said Twentie men of his said ffeoffe of Colton aforesaid nowe beynge or w[ill] beynge hereafter shalbe or the most xl of them Surrender, giv[en] deere and
 yeld upp into his hands of the lord or lordes of his said manor of Otry & Maner aforesaid or of his or her Eteward h[er]re for his tyme being, according to the custome of hisame manor, affred all his said messuages lands and tenements ad also all such right title &
 and interest ad hym & curay of hem hem living shall then haue of in and to the p[erson] with all and singuler his appurtenances in his manner & forme and unto such other p[erson] or p[erson] of the exet of Colton aforesaid as shalbe nominated and appoynted by his said Twentie
 men or the most xl of hem, to the like vs, intent and purpote ad id before mentoned and declared in his p[ro]mise Indentured and to none other vs. **In witness wherof** his said p[ro]mises to his p[ro]mises, haue to the same interchageably putt
 the hands and sealed the date & year first aboue written.
