

**This Indenture** Made the second day of April in the second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord James by the grace of God of England France & Ireland King Defender of the Faith & the one & twentieth of Scotland the six & fiftieth. **Witnesseth**

William apurghall of Bolton in the County of Devon yeoman of thone pt, And Joseph Longe, John Sampson son of William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill younger, James Causwill gentlemen, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn holder, John Holwill and Edward Bagwell yeomen of Bolton apurghall of thone pt: **witnesseth** That whereas the said William apurghall now is & standeth lawfully seized as of free & common burgage by copy of Court Rolls according to the Customs of the Manor of Ottery St. Marie in the said County of Devon, w<sup>ch</sup> George Shobridge and Edward Drake, John England holder, Walter Marcy, Walter Weston, Richard Carpenter, George Marcy and John Weston the younger of Wilbays now deceased together with the said Edward Drake, John England holder, Walter Marcy, Walter Weston, Richard Carpenter, George Marcy and John Weston the younger of Wilbays now deceased together with the said William apurghall, by reason of a gift & Surrender of one John Marcy of Affcathayns w<sup>ch</sup> in the gift of Bolton apurghall, do by his writing of two of Attorney concerning the same Surrender now att large it doth & maye appear: All w<sup>ch</sup> said Messuages land & Tenements with appurtenances by the death of the said George Shobridge, Edward Drake, John England holder, Walter Marcy, Walter Weston, Richard Carpenter, George Marcy & John Weston the younger of Wilbays are now lawfully come into the said William apurghall by right of Surrender: And forasmuch as it is evident & manifest apert to the said William apurghall, as also to the said inhabitants & copyholders of the said Town and gift of Bolton, that the said apurghall & the said copyholders have beene oppressed or Tenants of the said land & Tenement were appointed of trust and have not att any tyme taken the benefitt & advantage of the same to their owne private use, but that the rents issues & profite thereof yearly arising coming & growing, were by the said apurghall or better sort of the said copyholders of Bolton committed employed & bestowed to good & goodly commendable purposes & uses of charity: That is to saye, either for the finding of a Scholemaster for the good & virtuous education and bringing upp of children in learninge, for the speedy setting forth & furnishing of Soldiers to serve the Kinge in tyme of warres, for the relief & succour of poore, aged and impotent persons, and for the repairing and amending of bridges and high wayes w<sup>ch</sup> in the said gift and other good and charitable uses to be disposed and expended as occasion should serve, and as it should seeme most meet & convenient for the common wealthe & profit of the said copyholders of Bolton apurghall: Therefore the said William apurghall att the speciall instance request & desire apert of the said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell, as also of the said other good & well disposed copyholders of the said gift of Bolton, and having a good love zeale & affection towards the said gift, and w<sup>ch</sup> calling to his remembrance the trust & confidence before his tyme in him reposed concerning the disposing of the rents & profite of the said land & Tenement, doth now by these presents graunt & agree for himselfe his heires executors administrators and assigns, to the said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell and every of them, their heires executors & assigns, and heires executors and assigns of every of them, that the said William apurghall his heires or assigns before the feast of St. Michaels Churching next ensuing after the date hereof, upon reasonable request to him to be made, shall & will cheyly and absolutely Surrender & yield upp into the hands of the Lord or Lords of the said Manor of Ottery St. Marie apurghall or of his or their Steward there for the tyme being, according to the Customs of the said Manor, the said all the said Messuages land & Tenement and other the premises before recited & specified w<sup>ch</sup> all & singular their appurtenances, as also the estate title & interest of, in & to the same and of in & to every pt & part thereof to the trust and use of the said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell their heires & assigns for ever: And in consideration of the same Surrender to be made, and to the intent & purpose that the rents issues & profite of the said land & Tenement maye from henceforth be employed & bestowed to such and so like uses as are before recited: The said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell being now also appointed and nominated to stand seized of the same land & Tenement, only of trust & confidence, doe the said premises, graunt & agree & sealably and respectfully every of them for himselfe his heires executors administrators and assigns to the said William apurghall his heires executors administrators & assigns by these presents in manner & forme following, That is to saye, That they the said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell nor any one of them will not att any tyme hereafter give, graunt, demise, sell, Surrender or yield upp the said land or Tenement or any pt or part thereof to any person or persons otherwise then as shall be limited and appointed by the discretion of the Twenty men of Bolton apurghall now being or w<sup>ch</sup> hereafter shall be, or the most pt of them, And that the rents, issues and profite of the said Messuages land & Tenement yearly arising coming & growing shall not be bestowed employed or disposed att any tyme hereafter without the assent consent or agreement of the said Twenty men or the most pt of them for the tyme being, bee therunto before had and obtained: And that att such tyme as here shall be but two or three of the said Joseph Longe, John Sampson, William Weston, Robert Haurant, John Causwill, James Causwill, Walter Marcy, Thomas Haurantlyn, John Holwill & Edward Bagwell living, That then they the said persons living being but two or three in number, shall upon reasonable request unto them to be made in that behalf by the said Twenty men of the said gift of Bolton apurghall now being or w<sup>ch</sup> hereafter shall be, or the most pt of them, Surrender, give over, and yield upp into the hands of the Lord or Lords of the said Manor of Ottery St. Marie apurghall, or of his or their Steward there for the tyme being, according to the Customs of the same Manor, the said all the said Messuages, land and Tenements, as also all such right title & interest as they and every of them then living shall then have of in and to the premises w<sup>ch</sup> all & singular their appurtenances in such manner & forme and unto such other person or persons of the gift of Bolton apurghall as shall be nominated and appointed by the said Twenty men or the most pt of them to the like use intent and purpose as is before mentioned and declared in these presents and to none other use, In witness whereof the said parties to these presents have to the same Intencably putt their hands and Seales the daie and yeere first above written.
