to procure Admittances and to

Know all Men by these presents that I John Freke  
Palmer of Number 43 Pulteney Street Bath in the County of Somerset  
a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Honorable East India Companies Service  
the eldest son and also the heir according to the custom of the Manor of  
Ottery Saint Mary in the County of Devon of Samuel Palmer formerly of  
Colyton in the said County of Devon but since and late of Harwich in the  
County of Essex gentleman who was a customary or copyhold tenant of the  
said Manor and who died on or about the day of September  
One thousand eight hundred and twenty six intestate Do hereby constitute  
and appoint William Channon of Ottery Saint Mary aforesaid Builder  
and James Austen of the same place Victualler(customary or copyhold  
tenants of the said Manor) and Robert Tytherleigh of Axminster in the  
said County of Devon gentleman or any of them jointly and each of them  
severally my true and lawful Attorneys and Attorney for me and in  
my name and on my behalf but at the Costs of the hereditaments or  
surrendees hereinafter described or named or free from or not at any  
Cost to me to appear at the next or any subsequent general or at any  
special Court Baron or customary Court to be holden for the said Manor  
or before the Lord or Lady Lords or Ladies for the time being of the said Manor  
or his her or their Steward or Stewards for the time being thereof or any or  
either of such stewards or out of Court and either in or out of the said  
Manor and pray Admittance of and from and be admitted tenant  
by such Lord or Lady Lords or Ladies steward or stewards or any or either of  
such stewards and according to the custom of the said Manor Of the  
several hereditaments hereinafter mentioned respectively situate within  
the parish and Manor of Ottery Saint Mary aforesaid and being of the tenure  
of Old Barton and of which the said Samuel Palmer was admitted tenant  
in fee simple according to the custom of the said Manor at a Special Court  
Baron of the said Manor held there on the twenty fifth day of October One  
thousand seven hundred and ninety two that is to say All that one messuage  
and eight acres of land with the appurtenances under the  
yearly rent of three shillings And all that one messuage and one acre  
of land lying at Siphill foot under the yearly rent of seven shillings And  
also all those two acres of land lying at Alphington under the yearly

the yearly rents aforsaid and all other burthenwherchts customs suits and services  
therefor anciently due and of right accustomed and upon the trusts and to and for  
the intents and purposes mentioned and expressed or referred to of and concerning  
the same in and by an Indenture dated on or about the twenty fifth day of  
June — One thousand eight hundred and fifty three and expressed to be  
made between the said Frederick Barnes James Kingdon and the said John Snook  
of the first part me the said John Treke Palmer of the second part the said Sir John  
George Reeve de la Pole Sir Edward Marwood Elton Clifford Shirreff George Eyre Powell John  
Sampson John Latysone Scarbrough William Irelawny Hallett Harry de Spencer Kingdon  
Matthew Batstone and Samuel White of the third part which trusts intents and  
purposes correspond with the trusts intents and purposes upon to and for which  
the said Samuel Palmer held the same premises respectively And generally  
to do and execute or cause to be done and executed every any or all such other act or  
acts and thing or things as shall or may be or be deemed necessary or expedient  
to be done or executed in about or concerning such admittance or admittances surrender  
or surrenders as aforsaid or other the premises or any of them as fully and effectually  
as I the said John Treke Palmer could or might do in my own person or if I were  
personally present And I hereby confirm and agree to conform all and whatsoever my  
said Attorneys or any or either of them shall do or cause to be done in or about the premises or any of them
