

His Indenture made the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September in the hour and twenty years of the Reigne of our souveraine lord Charles by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France and  
of the ffeoffes of the said land Kinge defendor of the faith et 23<sup>rd</sup> Regne. John Younge & John Garfwell Edward Blataller gent John Gode John Wheler Giddens Hall and Walter Rydon feoffees of certaine of  
the Landes of Colyton of thowt & his heire Marke of Poliford within the p<sup>t</sup> of Colyton aforesaid husbandman of thother p<sup>t</sup> he witnesseth that the said John Younge John Garfwell Edward  
Blataller & John Gode John Wheler Giddens Hall & Walter Rydon feoffees of the said land p<sup>t</sup> of Colyton is the roght and assit of the twenty mon of the land p<sup>t</sup> of Colyton for p<sup>t</sup> in divers and  
of his summe of chareounys of £ 8 and lawfull monys of Englynd to thow the said feoffees by the said Henry Marke before thisse aliois deliverys of thid p<sup>t</sup> estate inde and truly as aid wher the said feoffees doe  
alwylches thow shold to be fayffed and sayd thid also for and in consideracyon of the yearly Rent in by the se segentes hereafter referred **Hire** deuised granted and to have and by these segentes doo  
paynt and to farme bot unto the said Henry Marke his portes & affyndes all that miffrayre or dwallours hys wher in the said Henry Marke now dwelleth in Poliford being p<sup>t</sup> of the land wher in one  
Richard Newell blacksmith wro bith child ill that little Cawden a lott lyng on the g<sup>t</sup> side of the said house as it is now inted from the garden of the said Richard Newell child all that p<sup>t</sup> of  
land wher in the p<sup>t</sup> of Poliford wher in the landes of Devon  
and boundet in the highe way leading from Poliford towards Colyton in the west. Land leading to a p<sup>t</sup> of land of one Polley Dolbret in the south the land of Paudall now in the oþer part  
of one & the Mart in the east and the highway on strett ther in the south and also all that oþer other p<sup>t</sup> of land w<sup>t</sup> the p<sup>t</sup> of Poliford contayning by appurtenance one Burgage or halfe a Burgage of  
land & t<sup>e</sup> more or leſs fruittys ayngt and beynge in the Burrow of Poliford aforesaid bthwys the landes of the houres of Galston w<sup>t</sup> lat in the Cunne or estuation of one Polley  
Wheler in the w<sup>t</sup> the highway on strett ther in the south the land of John Arundel of Excester Esquier and William de Cawd in the east and the landes of the houres of Richard an taller  
Newell in the south i.e. w<sup>t</sup> t<sup>e</sup> miffrayre as now in the Cunne of the said Henry Marke together w<sup>t</sup> the under wood Cawd of Excester 1/200 boote of boote further maynes easementes & of its commodities  
and fyd at an w<sup>t</sup> at godur & as no w<sup>t</sup> to be had of male to the only benefite & boote of the said Henry Marke his portes & affyndes **To Hare and to hold** the said miffrayre houses Galston  
Wheler and all thid the oþer miffrayre thid p<sup>t</sup> of land unto him the said Henry Marke his portes & affyndes & affynites from the day of the date w<sup>t</sup> of thisse thid  
the vchle hame of flourfrent & miffrayre fully to be remoued & dived if he the said Henry Marke Mary his wife and John Marke sonn of the said Henry Marke they on any one of them  
so long shall haue to live yereinge and sayngt thid yearly dureing the said earenes into the said John Younge John Garfwell Edward Wheler Giddens Hall & Walter  
Rydon feoffees thid hame & affyndes the Cunne of Englynd ffeoffes of good & lawfull monys of Englynd att the ffeoffes of the maner wher in the ffeoffe of i. Lord Greve & the ammunt of the  
bifforde Dyrus mary and i. John Garfwell Edward Wheler Giddens Hall and Walter Rydon their houres & affyndes to payne of them by these segentes that he the said  
Henry Marke his portes & affyndes shall ffeine two to thrid and att all times hereafter when and as often as neede shall & quare dureing the said earenes w<sup>t</sup> suffit w<sup>t</sup> by so sayed  
gypans & maintaine the said miffrayre and other thid miffrayre to thid p<sup>t</sup> of land in all other needfull and necessary expences att his  
and thid oþer expeſſe goit and heire or **If** it shall haue the said yearly Rent of thirtie shillinges to be paid and mowe in p<sup>t</sup> or w<sup>t</sup> by the boote of one moneth next after any  
boote of the ffeoffes aforesaid in whidh ought to be payd be my lawfully demanded and not paid or if the said Henry Marke his portes & affyndes shall ffeine or p<sup>t</sup> to  
lumbers or any p<sup>t</sup> or p<sup>t</sup> thereof to be leuid on in detay to the boote of John Shylling or about p<sup>t</sup> shall not suffit w<sup>t</sup> to pay and the said w<sup>t</sup> thid moneths after warininge to com to him  
his portes & affyndes to payne of them for all any oþer dñe of the Cunne aforesaid this p<sup>t</sup> gent deuise exent to be  
void any thinge in thid segentes contayninge in any wise notable standynge **In witness** wher of the p<sup>t</sup> abouedane to thid segent ffeoffees their hands & seales have sett upon the
